This visit for the Secretary of the Treasury and the Senior Advisor to the President was announced at a time when comparable hotels had no availability for the same time frame.

The Embassy has worked with Burj Rafal Hotel Riyadh previously which hosted the Senior Advisor to the President and the Secretary of the Treasury in October of 2018. The location, security features, and availability of the hotel are the primary driving force for this acquisition. The Burj Rafal had enough rooms to accommodate special security requirements, and also provided a competitive rate, which was in the best interest of the U.S. Government.

6. A description of efforts made to ensure that offers are solicited from as many potential sources as is practicable.

Due to the urgency and exception provided in FAR 6.302-2, this advertisement cannot be posted, but the JOFOC will be published in FedBizOpps.
