



n 1879, Colorado chartered the town of Frisco. A little more than a hundred years later, the Frisco Historic Park & Museum opened in 1983. The original schoolhouse serves as the main hub, with photos, artifacts and exhibits detailing everything from the area's early settlement to modern skiing.

However, the schoolhouse is only part of the museum. There are 13 other restored, historic structures that include a log chapel, a jail, mining cabins and ranch homes. A self-guided walking tour throughout the campus will give guests the chance to travel back through time as they listen to audiotapes or read the accompanying text.

"Children in particular love the Frisco train diorama, the Frank and Annie Ruth House dress up station and the interactive animal fur display in the Trapper's Cabin," museum manager Rose Gorrell said.

If that isn't enough, the museum hosts various activities throughout the year that take place on and off the grounds. Visitors and locals can tour the Bill's Ranch neighborhood, attend a lunchtime lecture on wildlife or spend the night at the museum listening to live music and enjoying light refreshments.

During Founder's Day, the site becomes the place to celebrate Frisco's heritage. Each year, there will frequently be burro rides, gold panning, costumed reenactments, lawn games, face painting, crafts

and other entertainment like cowboy poetry or a puppet show. During the park's 35th anniversary in 2018, there was a Ute Indian tipi dedication and a traditional performance by members of the tribe at the gazebo.

The gazebo is also the home for other community events such as the Frisco Christmas tree lighting,

an art show and more. In the summer, there are free concerts held each Thursday, with proceeds from alcohol sales going to a different local nonprofit every week.

The free Frisco Historic Park & Museum is open year-round at 120 Main St. in Frisco.

or the second year in a row Frisco Funk Collective has the honor of being named the best band in Summit County. Formed in 2015, the group consistently performs high-energy concerts filled with funky grooves.

Though Brooke Harthan moved away and is no longer the lead singer, the band is still going strong. The current lineup includes bassist and founder Tyler Easton, renowned Venezuelan drummer Leo Lopez, guitarist Eric James, tenor saxophonist Jon Neiman and multi-instrumentalist Adam Weidner, Easton has taken over the lead vocal duties, but other members occasionally will hop on the mic, too.

"What I love about funk music is its ability to reach people of all musical tastes and backgrounds and get them dancing," said Easton, who also performs in the band Satellite13 with Lopez and frequent Frisco Funk Collective

collaborator John Truscelli, "When you hear that heavy hit on the one. you can't help but move. It also gives us the platform to really explore the improvisational side of the tunes. which is what Frisco Funk is all about."

That improvisation from soloists - following the lead of their main influences such as Herbie Hancock, The Meters, Sly and the Family Stone and others — means no two Frisco Funk Collective shows are the same. It also helps to have a repertoire of more than 100 songs to fill out a set list each show. They

can accommodate if the gig requires a mellower, jazz-like vibe or bring down the house at a festival for throngs of partygoers.

"Part of the beauty of the collective and why I love

Agreat way to cap off the evening, whether after a day of shopping or skiing, is with a refreshing wine in hand. Thankfully the world's highest-elevation winery, Continental Divide Winery, has a location off Main Street in Breckenridge.

"Our tasting room is located just a one-minute walk from the base of the QuickSilver SuperChair, making Continental Divide's tasting room a great spot to relax and unwind with a glass of wine after a hard day on the slopes," Continental Divide Winery co-founder Jeffrey Maltzman said.

Part-time Breckenridge residents and California vintners Jeffrey and Ana Maltzman founded the winery in 2016 with Alma residents Kent Hutchison and Angela Bryan. The winery features the harvest from the Maltzman's California vineyards as well as local Colorado grapes.

Along with sampling wine, the tasting room offers a

unique blending experience. Participants taste four red wine varietals, craft a custom blend from them. and then bottle, cork and label the souvenir.

Those who wish to take home more than that single bottle should sign up for the winery's wine club. The club has no annual membership fee, and it's offered at different tiers that allow customization in shipment size.

The club is a good way to stay on top of new releases, like last year's limited edition Double Eclipse wine. The blend of six wines was made during the 2017 total solar eclipse and then released during the total lunar eclipse the following year.

More recently, the winery swept the Sunset Magazine International Wine Competition. It won two of the only three gold medals awarded to Colorado wineries in the 2019 contest out of 2,700 entries. The winning wines included the artist series Napa

With her first-graders, Kaskey puts students on a path toward brighter futures. She is also trained to observe students for reading difficulties and help them overcome them.

"I try to make learning fun, keep students engaged

and deliver high-quality literacy instruction daily," Kaskey said. "I want my students to love reading. I work tirelessly to find just the right book to get all students engaged in reading. I love buying books for students (and teachers)."

As far as why she decided to do one of the hardest and most important jobs in a community, educating the next generation, it's all about the impact she sees she has in their lives.

"I absolutely love teaching, it's my passion. I love watching my students learn and grow and discover new things. My students, past and present, mean the world to me."

iz Waddick, a Spanish teacher at Summit High School, sees her job as more than teaching Spanish to Summit High juniors to help them get a job — she sees it as a responsibility to help them become global citizens.

"I argue that, sure, learning a language might help get a job or get into college," Waddick said. "But more than that, it improves your quality of life and opens up entire new experiences and ways of thinking."

Waddick's approach to teaching Spanish is based in the idea that knowing another language improves people's lives.

"I approach teaching with the concept of developing caring learners with empathy," Waddick said. "Language is such a big part of that. It helps build

community, where people can learn from each other."

Waddick said her teaching style involves immersing students into the language through "movement," including acting scenes out, interviewing each other in Spanish and asking each other interesting questions in the language, such as what hopes and dreams they have.

As far as why she's a teacher, Waddick said it's all about helping her students become better people.

"I think it's a noble profession, and I'm proud to be a teacher," Waddick said. "I'm proud to get into the classroom every day to help give these kids a life that is of value."

or Jessie Unruh-Brossman, life in Summit County is about connecting.

The 2019 Ms. Summit County grew up in Wichita, Kansas, but said she has a rich family history in the area. Unruh-Brossman said her parents were farmers in Kansas who'd bring old barn wood up for projects in Breckenridge, an easy excuse for one or two family vacations every year to ski or hike.

She graduated from Kansas State University with a degree in television broadcasting and immediately decided to move to Summit County. "I came to be a snowboard bum, and I excelled," she joked.

Unruh-Brossman moved to Keystone to ski but quickly chose to begin her marketing career in Summit County. She started a job at the Breckenridge Tourism Office, where she served as a content marketing manager for about four years before moving on to work with Rocky Mountain Underground and eventually Breckenridge Distillery, where she serves

as the distillery's marketing manager.

"I think what I've really focused on in my career is supporting the community in terms of small businesses," she said. "I've always been really passionate about telling the stories of small businesses and trying to grow this community. ... I've chosen jobs and opportunities that allow me to do that and to really connect to my town."

Unruh-Brossman's work doesn't stop at the distillery. She said she also sits on the Community Affairs and Services Committee with the Breckenridge Tourism Office and is a frequent content contributor for the Colorado Tourism Office. Additionally, she takes on freelance work for live television in the action sports world — traveling around the world to Amsterdam. Manchester and Berlin to produce webcasts and live shows for events like Dew Tour and the X-Games.

Unruh-Brossman lives in Frisco with her husband. John, along with their two dogs — a pit bull named

Roxy and a border collie named Marley. In her free time, she said she's constantly trying to get the most out of Summit County's recreational opportunities taking hikes with her husband and dogs, skiing, paddle boarding and taking in the views.

She said she also enjoys winding down with a cold beer or cocktail on the patio at the end of the day, though she's had to put a stop to the ceremony as she and her husband are expecting a baby girl this winter — due on Christmas Eve, just before Unruh-Brossman and John's birthdays on Christmas and New Year's.

"There's a lot of places people can live that are beautiful and amazing," she said. "But I hope to raise a family in this community and to live here and continue to support everything Summit has to offer. ... I've lived in every town in Summit at some point in my life, and I've gotten to work with great companies. I've gotten to connect with people throughout the county. I think to be nominated for this speaks to a person's character



and their ability to connect to people and adapt to all kinds of situations and places. I think that's something I embrace as a person. I've really grown up in Summit, and it's all because of the community."

ommunity members will recognize Jason Ford as the proprietor of Broken Compass Brewing, a fixture in Breckenridge since the brewery opened its doors in summer 2013.

But there's a lot more to Ford than just beer, and what he enjoys more than anything is getting to bring people together.

"It completely surprised me," Ford said about his nomination for Mr. Summit County. "But I think it has to be about the community we've created. I'm just a regular guy out here trying to create a great place with a great product. If you can find something like this that brings people together, they pay attention. The beer helps too; it's the face of the brewery. But I really do think it comes from the love people have for this place — a great place for everyone to gather, hang out and see your friends."

Ford was born and raised in Wyoming before moving to Bozeman, Montana, where he earned a degree in chemical engineering at Montana State University. Following graduation, Ford made his first move to Colorado, where he said a Breckenridge Brewery stout at Coors Field first awakened his love for beer.

Shortly after, Ford moved to Portland, Oregon, where he put his degree to work serving as a chemist in an environmental laboratory, and in research and development in the fields of battery technology and aerospace defense. He returned to Denver a decade later to take on another research and development position but soon set his sights on something more ambitious.

"I took on a management position, and not being in the lab anymore and not being able to build anymore just wasn't my bag," Ford said. "I got bored. I wasn't creating anymore. I knew I had to do something different. I had a couple buddies working at breweries or starting breweries, and I thought that looked like a great job."

Ford opened the first iteration of Broken Compass Brewing in Denver in 2008 and moved the business to Breckenridge in 2013.



"I'm just a mountain guy at heart," Ford said. "To be able to have a mountain town brewery is a pie in the sky. It's been a dream of mine since I was a kid, so to make it happen is a blessing."

Ford lives with his wife, Jo, who he lauded for allowing him to chase his dreams. Ford said Jo is also a beer enthusiast and has helped develop some of the flavors Broken Compass patrons might be familiar with — calling the brewery's coconut porter "her baby."

While not working, Ford said he enjoys spending time outdoors biking and skiing as well as taking

advantage of Summit County's slow seasons to travel with his wife. Ford said he also takes an annual trek out west to Nevada's Black Rock Desert, where he spends four weeks on a crew building the man for the Burning Man festival.

"It's been so fun watching the community that we've been able to build here," Ford said. "The support we've seen from the community has been outstanding. And it's been really awesome to see that community develop and keep getting stronger every year."

he name Briar Rose has deep roots in Breckenridge. Back in the town's early days, the Briar Rose Mine produced silver, gold and other ores close to the top of Peak 10. The miners who worked there had a boarding house on Lincoln Avenue that they knew they could rely on for a warm bed, a good meal and a drink after a hard day's work.

Eventually, the Briar Rose boarding house became better known for its food and drinks than its bedrooms, and from these roots the Briar Rose Chophouse & Saloon was born. In its current location since 1960, the Briar Rose is still well-known as a destination to find a good meal and drink.

This year, voters have picked the restaurant as the Best Steak in Summit County. It's a title that General Manager David Lipka takes a great deal of pride in as well as the restaurant's ability "to mix our Old West heritage with modern day appetites."

The 28-day aged Black Angus steaks come from the Harris Ranch Beef Co., and the restaurant serves a variety of game meats. One of Lipka's personal recommendations is a dry-aged cowboy



buffalo rib-eye steak, which isn't on the main menu but can often be found as a special.

"Between the buffalo and the dry aging, it's not for everyone," Lipka said. "But it's life changing."

The Briar Rose Chophouse & Saloon is at 109 Lincoln Ave. in Breckenridge.

or nearly two decades Hacienda Real has been providing Summit diners authentic Mexican fare, a wide assortment of margaritas and speedy service. It's yet again taking home the first place prize for Best Mexican Restaurant in Summit County, a feat they said they've managed for the past 13 years.

When asked about their staying power, manager Luis Flores is quick to point out four things: service, food, customer service and consistency. They've managed to keep the same chef since they opened, and Flores is a well-known figure in the dining area, where he's quick to check in with customers to make sure they are fully satisfied.

Flores' favorite dish at the restaurant is the carne asada: a skirt steak filet that the restaurant serves with guacamole, salsa Mexicana and fried hot peppers. I hile Breckenridge Distillery makes award-winning whiskey, gin, rum and vodka, drinking the aged beverages neat isn't the only option when patronizing the distillery's restaurant. To complement chef David Burke's food menu is an equally diverse

cocktail menu crafted by liquid chef Billie Keithley. Keithley has been with the distillery for 10 of its 11 years, absorbing knowledge and honing her passion. "If it's edible, I can make a cocktail out of it," Keithley said. "Cocktail creativity is my passion in life and so is putting smiles on guests faces."

Working alongside bar manager Connor Bovich

and head bartender Liz Cleary, Keithley balances the menu with spins on classics and new craft creations. A few of these drinks reference one of Keithley's favorite media franchises: "Star Wars."

Guests can usually find the Obi-Wan Old Fashioned

made with Breckenridge Port Cask Whiskey, raw simple syrup, barrel-aged whiskey bitters and a brandied cherry; or the Yoda's Elixir, the PX Sherry Finish Whiskey combined with seasonal flavors like pomegranate, cranberry and cinnamon. Because the distillery cannot purchase outside liqueurs, anything alcoholic in the cocktail beyond the base spirit is made in-house.


She tries to focus on fresh ingredients from farmers markets and frequently implements honey in some fashion, but the ideas for cocktails can come from anywhere.



Names like Hot Hippie, Lone Ranger, Mr. Roboto and Mrs. Perfect might not readily bring sushi rolls to mind for some, but loyal patrons at Kemosabe Sushi & Sake would be quick to recognize them as a sampling of some of the restaurant's sushi rolls. If the unique names didn't give it away, some of the

ingredients found in them might help a diner understand what the restaurant's website describes as "specialty rolls featuring modern flavor profiles."

"We'll throw steak on our sushi," said sushi chef Matthew Merrill, referring to the restaurant's All American roll, which is filled with red crab, tempura asparagus and avocado and topped with seared beef tenderloin, sweet soy and green onion oil.

While the rolls might come across as inauthentic, Kemosabe's 2019 title as Best Asian Restaurant is just another bit of evidence that Assistant General Manager Roy Beinfest believes shows that Kemosabe is legit.

The restaurant actually started as a once-a-week specialty at Silverheels Bar & Grill but became popular enough that it was spun out into its own location next door. The restaurant has been in its own spot for 10 years.

One dish that shows the restaurant's ability to balance traditional flavors with innovative thinking is the hamachi collar, a regular item on the specials menu.

The item started with a problem: good yellowtail meat that was hard to put into a sushi dish because of the location of bones within the flesh.

"What are we going to do with this?" Beinfest said as he talked about the process of creating the dish.

The answer turned out to be making a variation of a more traditional Japanese dish: hamachi kama. The meat is cooked — bones and all — and served covered in a combination of the restaurant's signature sauces. It has become popular enough that it's being considered as a potential addition to the regular menu.

Besides the distinct riffs on classic Japanese dishes, Merrill and Beinfest agree on three ingredients that keep Kemosabe as a regular in Best of Summit: fresh fish, consistent product and local appeal.

wning and operating the Cool River Coffee House in Breckenridge has been the dream come true longtime Summit County local Diane Burris hoped it would be. She purchased Cool River from its previous owners three years ago in November. In the time since, the former manager of the Inxpot coffee shop in Keystone has made the place her own. The visual touchups have been minor — some new painting and lighting, taking out a drop ceiling and a change to the logo and signage. It's Cool River's menu that has seen more change.

Inheriting a shop with a collection of local regulars, a shop known for its quality baked goods, Burris started out by bringing on small batch local roasters, such as the shop's main roaster, Huckleberry Roasters of Denver. Cool River also has a rotating tap that features a different roaster every few weeks.

"That's been my focus," Burris said. "Really, really good coffee."

On the food side, Burris put out a new menu earlier this summer after months of preparation. Featuring homemade dishes made from scratch by Burris and the Cool River cooks, Burris said she thinks their homemade pork green chili is the best around. Between 7 a.m. and 3 p.m. daily, early or late risers can eat breakfast or lunch at any time. The options range widely and cater to various dietary preferences, from homemade chili, to sweet potato bacon breakfast tacos to quinoa porridge.

"There's a lot of coffee shops, a lot of restaurants in Breckenridge, so I wanted to find a niche." Buris said "'What is somebody else not doing?' Here, there's something for everyone, from the vegan to someone looking for comfort food to the meat eater."


Since launching the new menu, Burris said lunch has taken off at Cool River. If you happen to stop by, Burris said she's confident you'll find a coffee house experience that feels like home, with friendly service in prompt fashion.







nce opening seven years ago, Axis Sports Medicine has rapidly emerged as one of the gold standards for physical therapy services in Summit County.



Dr. Shelby Osborne is an obstetrician gynecologist and co-owner of the Swan Mountain Women's Center, at Farmers Korner in Breckenridge. The Swan Mountain Women's Center is a combined OB-GYN and family medicine practice providing primary care services for Summit County and surrounding communities. The center provides low- and high-risk obstetric care, infertility services, gynecological services, menopause management and all primary care services.

Osborne said that, considering 83% of women use their gynecologist as their primary physician, having a local and accessible OB-GYN and dedicated women's health practice is critical for Summit County residents.

"A low-risk pregnant woman, on average, sees her

physician 16 times during pregnancy," Osborne said. "At a minimum, a woman should have a yearly exam, but many patients are seen more frequently for infertility, hormones, birth control and acute care visits. When a patient needs to be seen, driving to Denver turns a 30-minute appointment into more than a three-hour commitment."

When asked why she thinks her patients nominated her as a Best of Summit doctor, she said she believes it's the personal and direct approach she takes to practicing medicine that her patients appreciate.

"I am very candid with patients," Osborne said. "I try to be approachable so that patients are inclined to trust me and be honest with me. I always try to explain things so that the patient understands clearly and could turn around and repeat it back to me. I always personally call all of my patients with abnormal results so that I can answer any questions the patient has about the issue at hand."

At the women's center, Osborne works with Dr. Andrew Catron, a founding partner, and Dr. Holly Hickman, a new addition to the center. Dr. Kathleen Cowie, who is also chief medical officer of the Summit Community Care Clinic, works once a week in the family practice, while Laura Amedro and Molly Lee serve as nurse practitioners twice a week.


Boyd said whether you have kids or not, the store has plenty of fun gadgets and gag gifts for adults, as well.



G rowing up in Littleton and attending school in the Vail Valley, John Spriggs has known about the area's fly-fishing waters for a long time. After learning how to fly-fish in Vail at age 10, Spriggs spent time out on the Eagle and Colorado Rivers and Gore Creek.

When a love for skiing brought Spriggs at the age of 22 up to Montana to pursue that wintertime passion, his love for fly-fishing grew.

"It fit my life really well," Spriggs said. "Just living the lifestyle: skiing in the winter, fly-fishing in the summer." Following his ski passion, Spriggs lived out of his truck for three years, spending time pursuing those passions in British Columbia, Alaska and Oregon. Spriggs returned to Colorado and began guiding for Cutthroat Anglers in Silverthorne in May. Since then, Spriggs has learned from

Cutthroat guiding veterans like Summit County local Trent Jones, who has experience ski coaching and fly-fish guiding.

Spriggs said he was hesitant for years to fly-fish guide because he didn't want the work element of the job to soil his love for the sport. But after a summer out on the water with Cutthroat, Spriggs said that hasn't been the case at all, as last winter's huge snow season has made the fishing good all summer.

"It's great to take people out who show interest in the sport and want to have this be a hobby, something they really get into," Spriggs said. "When you're teaching people and you know they are going to go on and fish for the rest of their life, it's just cool to see them at their beginnings getting into it."


What has Spriggs learned it takes to make for a good

fly-fishing guide here in Summit County?

"Every client is different," Spriggs said. "Every client has a different expectation. And not putting so much pressure on catching fish. It's about showing clients and people who come out here that fly-fishing is more about having a good time and going out to cool destinations. It's about getting outside, being in the moment — the now, a mindful state. The fish are just a plus, not putting too much pressure on that. Making sure clients are having fun and just enjoying being out somewhere a lot of people don't get to be: on the river."
