At 8:10 a.m., Thursday, January 7, 2010, Detective Sergeant Clifford States, DSN 3983, Crime Scene Supervisor, Homicide Section, advised the SODD dispatcher that he was responding to an "Active Shooter" call at ABB which is a 200,000 square foot facility located at 4350 Semple. There were three victims and the suspect remaining at the scene and surviving victims Stephen Sharp, Darrell Buckley, John Green, Keith Garner and Jerry Brown being transported to Barnes Hospital.

Accordingly, Lieutenant Colonel Alfred Adkins, DSN 1875, Deputy Chief, Bureau of Investigation and Support; Captain Michael Sack, DSN 4367, Commander, Crimes Against Persons and Property Division; Lieutenant Edward Kuehner, DSN 1484, Commander, Homicide Section; Detective Sergeant States DSN 3983, Homicide Supervisor; along with Homicide Detectives Jerone T. Jackson, DSN 4291; Lloyd White, DSN 4428; Heather Sabin, DSN 4631; Jimmy Hyatt, DSN 6513; Daniel Sweeney, DSN 5169; and Charles Betts, DSN 6454, responded to the scene.

Homicide Detectives Daniel Fox, DSN 5468, and Jocelyn Mercier, DSN 4679, responded to Barnes Hospital.

St. Louis Emergency Medical Unit #12 manned by Emergency Medical Technicians William Barnett, P11227, and Mario Stanton, B52024, responded to the scene and conveyed victim Sharp to Barnes-Jewish Hospital.

St. Louis Emergency Medical Unit #10 manned by Emergency Medical Technicians Christian Yacula, P12175, and Nathaniel Lett, B55067, responded to the scene and conveyed victim Buckley to Barnes-Jewish Hospital.

St. Louis Emergency Medical Unit #5 manned by Emergency Medical Technicians Jason Barker, D23026, and Keith Girardier, P15491, responded to the scene and conveyed victim Garner to Barnes-Jewish Hospital.

St. Louis Emergency Medical Unit #14 manned by Emergency Medical Technicians Glorine Lampe P16396, and Mark Tucker, B40371, responded to the scene and conveyed victims Brown and Green to Barnes-Jewish Hospital.

At the Barnes-Jewish Emergency Room, Detectives Mercier and Fox noted victim Sharp sustained gunshot wounds to his buttocks and abdomen. Victim Buckley sustained gunshot wounds to his abdomen and left knee. Victim Green sustained a gunshot wound to his right wrist, and hand. Victim Garner sustained a gunshot wound to his right leg. Victim Brown sustained a gunshot wound to his right leg. Doctor Greg Folkert listed the victims in critical and stable condition.

At the scene, Homicide Detectives were met by the Deputy Commander of Community Policing, Major Lawrence O'Toole, DSN 2202 and ABB Incident Scene Commander.

Major O'Toole stated Sixth District Officers, responded to a radio assignment for shots fired at 4350 Semple. Sergeant Byron Harrington was the first to arrive and observed a vehicle travelling north on Semple being struck by

gunfire.

Sergeant Harrington advised at approximately 6:34 a.m., Thursday January 7, 2010, he heard a radio transmission from the Sixth District dispatcher regarding shots fired inside the business at 4350 Semple, cross street Geraldine. From southbound Union at Highway 70, Sergeant Harrington preceded west on Bircher to Riverview then east on Bircher to Semple.

At that location he encountered a white female in a red vehicle. She was north on Semple stopped at Bircher. She waved her arm to get his attention and pointed south from his location. Sergeant Harrington proceeded south on Semple which is on a slight incline and observed approximately fifty feet from the intersection, a white Volkswagen followed by a black Chevrolet SUV.

At the same moment his attention was directed towards the two vehicles, gunfire erupted and appeared to be coming from the east side of his southbound patrol car. At that time he observed the Volkswagen begin to make a slight turn westward and the glass on its passenger side began to break in unison with the gunfire.

Sergeant Harrington indicated he could smell a heavy odor of fresh gunpowder and knew the shooter was very close, but he could not locate him. The black Chevy Blazer came along the passenger side of the white Volkswagen. Sergeant Harrington notified the dispatcher to keep all officers out of the area because the shooter was using an assault rifle and his position could not be determined.

The black Chevy Blazer and white car collided several times with each other leading Sergeant Harrington to believe the gunfire was coming from one of the two vehicles. The Chevy Blazer continued east on Bircher then south on Union where it was stopped by Sixth District Sergeant James Kenny, Officers Michael Langsdorf, Adam Duke, Jeffrey Stone, Kevin Payne, and Sergeant Harrington. The driver of the Chevy Blazer, victim John Green, was placed in the rear of a police cruiser where he was secured while awaiting medical treatment.

During the evacuation process EMS technicians were instructed to stage at Union and Bircher. Sergeant Harrington returned to the Semple location and learned from Sergeant Kenny that the victim inside of the white Volkswagen appeared to have expired.

While receiving updates on the shooting from the dispatcher, Sergeant Harrington requested the dispatcher maintain telephone contact with one of victims inside the building so that the responding Police Officers could gain entry into the building. Sergeants Harrington and Kenny were able to gain entry from an employee who was inside the Visitors Center.

Sergeant James Kenny, Officer Michael Langsdorf and Officer Adam Duke, responded to the area, approaching eastbound on Bircher. It should be noted that Sergeant Kenny along with Police Officers Langsdorf and Duke were all riding in

the same unmarked covert Police vehicle, assigned to a "Burglary Detail" in District Six.

An officer advised over the radio that a black SUV, was driving erratically on Semple and could possibly be involved in the incident. Police Officers Langsdorf and Duke observed that vehicle travelling erratically northbound on Semple before turning onto eastbound Bircher. Police Officers Langsdorf and Duke followed the vehicle to the intersection of Bircher and Union where they activated their covert vehicle's emergency lights and siren as the Blazer turned south onto Union. The Blazer slowed and stopped behind two parked marked police vehicles.

Upon approaching the Blazer, Police Officer Duke observed a black male driver and ordered him out of the vehicle pending further investigation. Officer Duke observed the subject to be injured and bleeding from his right arm. After a brief interview it was discovered that this subject was a victim. Police Officers Duke and Langsdorf heard gunshots emanating for the area of Semple and Bircher. The Officers responded back to the intersection of Semple and Bircher.

As the Officers approached the intersection, turning south onto Semple, they observed numerous officers in tactical positions outside of their vehicles on the side of the road. After determining that the immediate area was secure, and while still hearing several gunshots in the area, Sergeant Kenny and Officer Duke exited their vehicle and used it as tactical concealment as Officer Langsdorf drove south on Semple in search of possible suspects or victims.

While travelling south on Semple, they observed a white four door Volkswagon with heavily-tinted windows, running with its headlights on, stopped in the road, facing north on Semple. Upon observing apparent collision and ballistic damage to the front and right side of the vehicle, Officer Langsdorf parked his unmarked Police vehicle, exited, and approached the white Volkswagon with Police Officer Duke. Police Officers Duke and Langsdorf observed a person in the driver's seat of the vehicle, who was not responding to verbal commands.

While Police Officer Duke covered the vehicle for safety, Sergeants Kenny and Hoelting, and Police Officers Langsdorf and Wactor approached the vehicle tactically and attempted to open the doors. Upon finding the doors to be locked, and given that the windows were so heavily tinted and that it was unclear whether this vehicle could possibly belong to a suspect or a victim, Sergeant Hoelting and Police Officer Langsdorf broke the left front and rear door windows of the vehicle. After breaking the windows, they were able to determine that there was one subject inside, found lifeless with an apparent gunshot wound to the head.

Police Officers Langsdorf and Duke and Sergeant Kenny re-entered their unmarked Police vehicle and continued travelling south on Semple in search of suspects or any additional victims.

Officers Duke, Langsdorf, and Sergeant Kenny provided cover for the security guard so he could safely leave the shack and run across the parking lot, to the covert unmarked Police vehicle. The security officer was secured in the passenger seat of the covert unmarked Police vehicle.

They continued southbound on Semple Ave. to the rear guard shack where the Police Officers observed an unknown white male doubled over on his knees, bleeding profusely from his upper right leg. Police Officers Duke and Langsdorf, and Sergeant Kenny picked up the victim and placed him in the rear seat of the Police vehicle.

Officer Langsdorf drove the victim to the EMS staging area at Bircher and Union where he was turned over to EMS. Officer Langsdorf responded to the victim/witness staging area and dropped off the security officer. Officer Langsdorf responded to the rear guard shack and met Officer Duke and Sergeant Kenny.

They located two other workers and placed them inside their Police vehicle. Police Officer Langsdorf transported them to the victim/witness staging area. Police Officer Langsdorf responded back and met Officer Duke and Sergeant Kenny.

They pushed open the rear gates and drove their covert unmarked Police vehicle to the "C" Annex building, which was the machine shop. They walked into the entrance through the open garage door and observed numerous spent cartridge casings scattered across the floor, which were of different calibers.

They observed an individual standing at the door of an office which was located on the southeast wall of the Annex. The individual stated it was his son's office and he had been shot. Officers Duke and Langsdorf opened the door and observed a male lying on his back, behind a closet door. His feet were facing eastbound and his head was facing west. The male subject was unconscious and was not breathing.

Police Officers Duke and Langsdorf, and Sergeant Kenny walked northbound through the shop and observed an unknown black male shot in the abdomen and right leg. Another uniform Officer was rendering aid to this victim. Police Officers Duke and Langsdorf, and Sergeant Kenny assisted the wounded individual to the rear seat of their covert unmarked Police vehicle. Officer Langsdorf drove the wounded male and the two other workers to the front of the complex. Police Officer Langsdorf took the wounded individual to the EMS staging area where EMS personnel rendered aid. The Highway Patrol and FBI integrated their S.W.A.T. units and were assigned to clear the large plant and offices located east of the area where St. Louis City and County's S.W.A.T. units were searching.

The FBI S.W.A.T. unit responded to the ABB facility at the request of the St. Louis Metropolitan Police Department and conducted a secondary search of the main facility. Don Wilson, who is the father of victim Corey Wilson, responded to the St. Louis City Medical Examiner's Office (Morgue). At the Morgue, he positively identified the victim as his son, Corey Wilson.

At approximately 3:00 p.m., the scene was relinquished to Homicide Detectives.

Initiating the investigation at the scene, the Detectives observed that the incident occurred within the Sixth Police District and in the neighborhood known as Mark Twain/ I-70 Industrial. The 4300 block of Semple is a north and southbound thoroughfare, bordered on the south by railroad tracks and on the north by Bircher. The street at that location consists of two north/south traffic lanes; and is made of asphalt. The area is commercial consisting of commercial buildings and parking surfaces, which are situated on both the east and west sides of the street. Street lights along the west side of the street illuminated the area. The incident, as well as the scene investigation, took place during the hours of dawn, daylight, and darkness.

The weather conditions at the time of the incident, as reported by the National Weather Service at Lambert Field, on Thursday, January 7, 2010, were poor; at 6:25 a.m., it was dark, the temperature was approximately 17 degrees, with light snow and winds to the west at 17 miles per hour, gusting up to 34 miles per hour. There was already three inches of snow on the ground that morning and another 1.3 inches fell throughout the day.

The Detectives directed their attention to the commercial business ABB designated at 4350 Semple, a multiple building manufacturing facility, made of masonry, steel and wood, situated on the eastside of Semple. ABB is a Power Transformer manufacturing company that occupies seventeen acres of land at the southeast corner of Semple and Bircher. The complex layout is comprised of three buildings A, B and C, three paved parking lots and storage and loading dock areas. The complex is surrounded by a nine foot chain link fence with three strands of barbed wire on top.

Located along the eastern property boundary, on Semple from Bircher north to south are Buildings A and B and three parking lots. A parking lot is on the corner of Semple and Bircher, south of this parking lot is the Bircher Main Office Building (Building A), a paved parking lot is situated between the Main Office Building and the Winding Upper Area. Located to the south are the Winding Area, Assembly and Test Areas (Building B). Contained within Building B are the Winding Area Test and Assembly Areas. The Winding Upper Building is adjoined to the northern side of the Winding Area.

The eastern side of the Winding Upper Area is also adjoined to the western side of the Assembly Area. Contained within the Assembly Area, from north to south, is the Assembly Lower Area, Vapo and Assembly Aisle, Supervisor Mabry's Office area, Test Floor and Test Offices on the second floor.

Continuing east from Building B, is the Annex Area Building C. Contained within Building C from south to north are the Shipping and Receiving, Warehouse, Maintenance, Assembly and the Semple Office areas. The Shipping and Receiving area is adjoined to the western side of the Assembly Area, which is located near the southern edge of Building C. The loading dock is located along the southern wall of Building C.

The Detectives were advised that during the shooting incident, victim John Green drove his black 1995 Chevy Blazer northbound on Semple, while attempting to flee from the shooter. The shooter, later identified as Timothy H., exited a door along the west side of the Winding Building and fired multiple shots at Green and victim Carlton Carter, who was also northbound on Semple in a white Volkswagen

At least one gunshot shattered the window, struck victim Green in the wrist, continued through (shattering the opposite window) and struck the driver's side outer mirror. Victim Green continued northbound on Semple, turned eastbound on Bircher and then southbound on Union, where District Officers stopped him. (Refer to Green's statement for further information).

At this scene, Detective Sabin observed a 2-door, black 1995 Chevy Blazer, bearing Missouri license WD9S4G, with vehicle identification number 1GNCS18W5S2107730, parked facing southbound, along the west curb, in front of 4441 Union. The driver and front passenger windows were shattered. The driver's side outer mirror was partially broken off and the mirror shattered. There were glass fragments on the driver and passenger seats and floorboards of the vehicle. Snow had blown inside as well. There was damage to the front passenger quarter panel and passenger door.

The vehicle was towed to Laclede Garage by City Tow and processed by Evidence Technician Officer Rodney Thomas, DSN 3100.

The Detectives directed their attention to the west curb area located south of the intersection of Semple and Bircher. Detective Jackson observed a White 2002, Volkswagen, four-door, having Missouri 2010 license number WD2-T9F and vehicle identification number WVWRH63B82P035380, near the west curblines, facing north. A computer inquiry of the license plate revealed that the vehicle was registered to Carlton Carter, at 6326 Henner Avenue St. Louis Missouri.

Inside the vehicle, the Detectives observed a key in the vehicle's ignition in the "off" position, with the transmission selector being in the "Park" position. The vehicle's engine was not running and the odometer reading was not available. The vehicle's windows were raised. All four vehicle windows were damaged broken/smashed out. All the vehicle doors were closed with the driver's door unlocked.

Inside the vehicle, the Detectives observed the victim seated in the driver's seat with his shoulders and head leaning toward the right side of the vehicle.

The driver's seat belt was across the victim's chest and secured to the seatbelt buckle. The victim's feet were on the front floorboard, pointed north and head pointed east. The victim evidenced puncture wounds to both sides of his head. He was clad in a blue jacket, a black hooded sweat shirt, a white button down shirt, gray pants, a black belt and dark boots. There was apparent blood on the victim's face and torso.

There was apparent blood on the driver's seat, center console, steering wheel and dashboard of the vehicle.

The Detectives observed collision damage to the front right side bumper, and apparent debris from the collision was located on the ground near the front bumper and under the vehicle.

The Detectives observed several bullet holes along the right side of the vehicle with ballistic damage to both passenger side windows. Located at the base of the rear windshield near the right side of the vehicle, was a bullet hole.

Located on the driver's door, was a bullet hole with damage to both left side windows. The Detectives were advised that the damage to the left side windows was caused by Police Officer Michael Langsdorf while he was investigating the vehicle.

Located on the ground near the rear of the vehicle, were damaged pieces of the front bumper.

Located on the street near the west curb line, approximately one hundred feet south of the Volkswagen, were small pieces of tinted vehicle window glass and a trail of white plastic from the bumper.

The vehicle was towed to the St. Louis Metropolitan Police Department's Laboratory Garage by City Tow and processed by Evidence Technician Officer Rodney Thomas, DSN 3100.

The Detectives directed their attention to the area located south of the White 2002, Volkswagen, to a Silver 2009, Toyota Corolla four-door, having Missouri 2010 license number AD8-P8P and vehicle identification number 1NBU40E49Z136827, near the center of the street, facing north. A computer inquiry of the license plate revealed that the vehicle was registered to EAN Holdings LLC, (Alamo Rental) at 10144 Page Avenue St. Louis Missouri 63132.

Inside the vehicle, the Detectives observed the vehicle's ignition in the "off" position, with the transmission selector being in the "Park" position. The vehicle's engine was not running and the odometer reading was not available. All four vehicle windows were raised. All the vehicle doors were closed with the driver's door unlocked.

There was no apparent damage to the vehicle and it appeared to have been

abandoned in the north bound traffic lane of Semple Avenue. A Detective discovered an Alamo rental agreement with the renter being Hossien Rezia inside the vehicle. The vehicle was photographed by Evidence Technician Officer Rodney Thomas, DSN 3100

The vehicle was towed to the St. Louis City Tow Yard located at 7410 Hall Street by City Tow.

The Detectives were directed to the western property line area on the east side of the fence, adjacent to the Winding Room Section at 4350 Semple. Located on the ground, west of the Winding room exit were seven 7.62 x 39 caliber cartridge casings. Cones number one through seven were placed there to mark their location.

Continuing southwest from that location near the east sidewalk, on the west side of the perimeter fence, were two 7.62 x 39 cartridge casings. Cones number eighteen and nineteen were placed there to mark their location.

Detectives Sabin and White responded to the southwest parking lot at the southwest end of the ABB complex. The lot was surrounded on three sides by a nine foot metal cyclone fence and was adjacent to the Winding/ Assembly Room Area of Building B on the north and the Test segment of Building B on the east side. The lot was accessible by two separate entry/exit gates along the western edge (onto Semple Ave.) and an entry/exit gate along the southern edge (onto a driveway running westbound onto Semple Ave.). There were four lanes of parking spaces available extending north and southbound.

There was an entry/exit door giving access to the parking lot along the west wall of the Test area of Building B. There were apparent blood drops in the snow from the doorway, extending south towards the parking lot. There were three white hardhats strewn in the snow along the pathway leading from the building onto the southwest parking lot.

There were seven bullet holes that penetrated the south exterior wall of the Winding Room Area Building B.

Just west of the exterior wall of the Test Room Area was the parking lot guard house. The guard house was a raised structure, elevated approximately five feet from the parking lot, and measured approximately ten feet by ten feet, which is accessible by two sets of metal stairs leading to doors on the north and south side of the structure. The guard house contained several desks, chairs and video surveillance equipment. There were ten (10) bullet holes in the west wall of the guard house that penetrated the wall and window of the structure. The bullets exited through the rear (east) wall and shattered the rear (east) window of the structure, striking the west exterior wall of the Test Building. There was a bullet hole in the south wall of the guard house. There was a bullet hole in the exterior wall and the window was shattered by multiple bullet holes on

the north wall of the guard house. Several bullet fragments were located on the interior floor of the guard house.

The following vehicles parked on the southwest parking lot were damaged:

The Detectives directed their attention to the south of the Winding Room on the parking lot. Detectives Sabin and White observed a 1999, maroon Chrysler Concord, four-door, having Illinois 2010 license number H235394 and vehicle identification number 23CHD46J6XH55872, near the midline of the parking lot, facing west. A computer inquiry of the license plate revealed that the vehicle was registered to Ryan and Bradford Wagner at 3259 Foster Road Alton Illinois.

This vehicle had four (4) bullet holes in the front windshield and two (2) bullet holes in the right front quarter panel.

The Detectives directed their attention to the parking space area immediately south of the Concord. Detectives Sabin and White observed a 1997, green Honda Accord, four-door, having Illinois 2010 license number LCSJAS6, and vehicle identification number 1GHCD5638VA229044, near the midline of the parking lot, facing west. A computer inquiry of the license plate revealed that the vehicle was registered to Lorin and Jill Smith at 75 Bender Avenue East Alton Illinois.

This vehicle had three (3) bullet holes and multiple strikes in the driver's side window.

The Detectives then directed their attention to the immediate southeast direction of the Accord. Detectives Sabin and White observed a 1993, silver Pontiac Grand Am, four-door, having Illinois 2010 license number A112208, and vehicle identification number 1G2NE5439PC745514, near the midline of the parking lot, facing west. A computer inquiry of the license plate revealed that the vehicle was registered to Maury Bingham, at 801 Hillsboro Edwardsville Illinois.

This vehicle had one (1) bullet hole in the front passenger door and the front passenger tire appeared to have been struck and flattened by a bullet.

Victim # 3, later identified as Terry Mabry, was located on the ground of the southwest parking lot with his head to the south and feet to the north, partially on his left side. Victim Mabry was clad in a black coat, a grey sweatshirt, a hooded camouflage jacket, blue jeans, white socks and brown boots. The victim had a wallet containing a Missouri Drivers License, \$100.00 in U.S. Currency (two \$50.00 bills) and other personal papers in his right rear pants pocket; a set of car keys and a small folding pocket knife in his right front pants pocket and a cell phone in his right lower side pocket. The victim had a laceration to his right eyebrow, a puncture wound to the right rear calf and a large puncture wound to the top left side of his head.

There was a pair of metal frame eyeglasses just south of victim Mabry's head. West of the victim's body, on the ground, was one (1) .380 caliber shell casing

(indicated by cone #12). East of the victim's body were five (5) .380 caliber shell casings (indicated by cones #8, #9, #10, #11 and #17). Southwest of the victim's body, on the ground, were four (4) 7.62 x 39 shell casings (indicated by cones #13, #14, #15 and #16). Southwest of the victim's body, on the ground, were two (2) empty 7.62 x 39 caliber magazines (indicated by cones A and B). Northeast of the victim's body, on the ground, was one (1) empty 7.62 x 39 caliber magazine (indicated by cone C).

The Detectives were directed to the southern section of the southwest parking lot and observed a 1997, maroon Dodge Intrepid, four-door, having Missouri 2011 license number MD2-S4F and vehicle identification number 2B3HD46F9VH771619, near the southern side of the parking lot, facing east. A computer inquiry of the license plate revealed that the vehicle was registered to Kenneth McCellen, at 5042 Castle Douglas St. Charles, Missouri.

The vehicle's engine was off and the gear shift was in the park position. The vehicle's windows were raised. Both vehicle front windows were damaged and partially broken out. All the vehicle doors were closed and locked.

Located south of the 1997 Dodge Intrepid was a black cell phone and cell phone battery lying upon the parking lot. Cone "F" was placed there to mark their location.

Located on the parking lot southwest of Cone "F" was an apparent circular pattern blood stain. Cone "D" was placed there to mark its location. Due to the weather conditions Officer Ludwig was unable to place a silhouette there to depict the position of the victim, after he was transported to Barnes Hospital by Emergency Medical Technicians.

Officer Ronald Ludwig advised victim Sharp was observed lying on his stomach, head towards the north and feet south, when he arrived at the scene. Officer Ludwig advised victim Sharp was lying on a Smith & Wesson .380 caliber semi-automatic handgun. Officer Ludwig seized the handgun from the ground and later conveyed it to the department Laboratory as evidence.

Continuing southwest, Detective Jackson observed a projectile on the ground. Cone number twenty was placed there to mark its location.

Located near the base of the southern perimeter southwest parking lot guard shed and gate were several apparent blood droplets. Cone "E" was placed there to mark its location.

The Detectives were directed to the area immediately south of the Manufacturing parking lot perimeter gate, east of Semple. The Detectives observed a 2007, gold Kia Optima, four-door, having Missouri 2010 license number KA5-P9C and vehicle identification number KNAGE123475084069, outside the parking lot, facing north. A computer inquiry of the license plate revealed that the vehicle was registered to Corine Clark, at 4762 Cupples St. Louis Missouri.

The vehicle's engine was not running and the gear shift was in the park position. The vehicle's windows were raised. The vehicle was unoccupied and appeared to be in working condition, without any visible damage. Snow was atop the vehicle roof and hood. All the vehicle doors were closed and unlocked.

The Detectives directed their attention to the Annex Building C, loading/receiving dock area. Access to this area is gained through the gate located southeast of the Manufacturing parking lot. The gate was open during the scene investigation.

The Detectives responded to the Annex Building C, loading/receiving dock area, located east of the Manufacturing parking lot. The Detectives were directed to the area south of the main Annex entrance. The Detectives observed a 1997, Nissan, gold Altima, four-door, having Missouri 2011 license number YC7-29L and vehicle identification number 1N4BU31D6VC277330, parked east of a flatbed trailer, facing north. A computer inquiry of the license plate revealed that the vehicle was registered to Kathleen and Timothy H., at 307 Dobbin St. Louis County, Missouri.

The vehicle's engine was not running and the gear shift was in the park position. The vehicle's windows were raised. The vehicle was unoccupied and appeared to be in working condition, without any visible damage. Three of the vehicle doors were open and unlocked, with the left rear door closed. Various articles of clothing and debris from the vehicle were located on the ground. Detective Jackson was advised that the vehicle was searched by members of the Bomb and Arson Unit for improvised explosive devices.

During the investigation it was discovered that this is the vehicle Timothy H. drove to the scene just prior to the homicide. The vehicle was towed to Laclede Garage where it was later processed for additional evidence by St. Louis Metropolitan Police Evidence Technicians.

Evidence Technician Officers Don Reynolds, DSN 4310, Brain King, DSN 4898, and Rodney Thomas, DSN 3100, processed the above described portion of the scene.

The Detectives responded to the main entrance on the south side of the Annex area of Building C, which is located at the southeastern corner of the ABB property boundary. The Building of metal and brick construction is situated along the eastern edge of the complex. The Annex area is comprised of several office break area locker rooms along the east wall, rail tracks located west of the offices, including open work spaces, storage and an assembly area west of the rail tracks. The building has a vaulted ceiling with large lift cranes overhead.

Located on the floor of the Annex building from south to north, were five 12 gauge cartridge casings, sixty-one 7.62 x 39 cartridge casings, and one 7.62 x 39 cartridge. Cones number one through sixty-seven were placed there to mark

their exact location.

The Detectives were directed to the manager's office located along the east wall of the Annex building. The office entry door and doorframe were made of metal, hinged on the south and opened inward towards the east. There were two indentation defects to the outside of the door located to the right of the doorknob. The office door was open, and there was no visible damage to the lock or strike plate area of the doorframe.

Located south of the manager's office door was the west outer wall of the manager's office and storage area. The Detectives observed approximately thirty bullet holes to the exterior of that wall. Located north of the manager's office door was a window. The window had apparent ballistic damage.

The manager's office and its contents are as follows:

Located near the center of the room was an "L" shaped desk. Behind the desk near the east wall was an office style chair. Located atop the desk was a keyboard and computer monitor, several office related articles and other forms and documents.

Located along the west wall of the manager's office from south to north was the entrance door and a book shelf beneath the window. The window was not covered by curtains or blinds. Located along the north wall from west to east was a small waste basket continuing east in the corner was a small refrigerator with office material atop it.

Located along the east wall, from north to south, was a bulletin board. Located along the south wall, from east to west, were two file cabinets, a bulletin board and a cart with a tool box atop it. There was apparent ballistic damage observed on the wall, bulletin board and file cabinet. Debris and multiple bullet fragments were located on the floor and surfaces of the office. Continuing west was the entrance to the manager's office storage room.

The storage room's entry door and doorframe were made of metal, hinged on the west and opened inward toward the south. During the scene investigation, the storage room door was open approximately twelve inches. There were apparent bloodstains on the doorknob and door. Detective Jackson observed a cell phone and apparent bloodstains on the threshold of the storage room.

The Detectives directed their attention to the interior of the storage room of the manager's office. Victim Cory Wilson was observed lying on his back bleeding from a puncture wound to the right side of his neck and shoulder. His head was to the west and feet to the east. His head was against the base of the west storage room wall. There was apparent blood on his face, neck and torso. Wilson was clad in a maroon shirt and blue jean pants secured by a brown leather belt and brown boots.

Located on the west wall of the storage room, the Detectives observed approximately twenty-nine bullet holes and apparent blood spatter and droplets. Located on the north wall of the Storage room was apparent ballistic damage. Located along the south wall were storage shelves and file cabinets. The Detectives observed apparent ballistic damage to those items. Debris and multiple bullet fragments were located on the floor, surfaces of the shelves, and cabinets.

Located on the floor near the east wall was an apparent bloodstain.

The Detectives directed their attention to the Winding/Assembly Building, which is a U shaped building of metal and brick construction. The Building is situated along the west edge of the complex (just east of Semple). The building is comprised of a Winding portion (Building B) along the west, (which has a ground level floor, including open work spaces, storage and offices), a partial upper floor (Test Room), and an Assembly area, (Building B) along the east side (which is a three story, vaulted ceiling factory area).

The Winding/Assembly Building is accessible by the following entry/exits doors: one at the northwest side, two along the east side, one at the southeast side, two along the west side (leading to the southwest parking lot), one at the southwest side and one along the west side (leading to Semple). The Winding building (Building B) from north to south consists of a large open storage/work area that continues the length of the building on the west side, and consists of offices along the east side, and a stairway that accesses the upper level (Test Room) and down to the ground level of the Assembly area (Building B).

The office portion of the building from north to south consists of a north/south hallway with offices along the east and west sides, numbered 210 through 200. The office numbered 210 had a window that faced north (out to the storage work area), a window that faced west (to the hallway), and a doorway that faced west. Offender # 1, later identified as Timothy H., was located in this office.

Room 210 contained: along the south wall, from east to west, several boxes of computer supplies and computer equipment; along the east wall, from south to north, a metal coat rack with several jackets, a wooden four-drawer dresser; along the north wall, from east to west, was a wooden desk with miscellaneous office equipment on top and a pair of black gloves; along the west wall, from north to south, was a desk with the following items on top: a computer monitor (with a bullet hole through the screen and a bullet indent in the wall behind the screen), other miscellaneous office equipment, a Romarm AK-47 rifle with a serial #1971CR3188 (unloaded), a Tristar 12 gauge pump-action shot gun with a serial #M9A01688 (unloaded), a box containing thirty-three (33) Wolf 7.62 x 39 cartridges, and two (2) banana style rifle magazines (one empty and one contained six (6) Wolf 7.62 x 39 cartridges), and a doorway accessing the hall. On the floor along the west wall, behind the desk was a bullet. Just east of the desk (along the east wall) was a Hi-Point .40 caliber S&W pistol with a serial #X769837 (containing one cartridge in the chamber and seven (7)

cartridges in the magazine.

Offender Timothy H. was seated in an office chair along the east wall of the office, with his feet to the southwest and head to the northeast. Timothy H. had plastic Flex Cuffs securing his right and left wrists to the arms of the chair. He had an orange ear plug in his left ear. Timothy H. had one puncture wound to his right neck/chin area with apparent stippling around the wound and had blood extending from his nose onto the front of his shirt. Timothy H. was clad in a tan long sleeved shirt, a white t-shirt, a pair of thermal pants, a pair of blue jeans, a black belt, a pair of grey socks, brown boots and a blue Rams baseball hat. There was \$42 in U.S Currency located in his left front pants pocket.

Timothy H. had a green and tan camouflage storage pouch secured around his waist. The pouch contained the following items: one box of 45 caliber cartridges (containing eighteen (18) cartridges), one box of .40 caliber cartridges (containing twenty (20) cartridges), two boxes of 12 gauge shotgun shells (each containing five (5) shells), one box of 7.62 x 39 cartridges (containing twenty (20) cartridges).

Located on Timothy H.'s waist area, attached to his belt were the following items: near the right front hip was one black dual magazine pouch containing two (2) magazines, each loaded with nine (9) .45 caliber cartridges; near the left hip was one black dual magazine pouch containing two (2) magazines, each loaded with ten (10) .40 caliber cartridges; near the left hip was one empty black holster with an attached magazine pouch containing a magazine, loaded with ten (10) .40 caliber cartridges; and near the right rear buttocks was one black holster with an attached magazine pouch containing a magazine, loaded with nine (9) .45 caliber cartridges and a Hi-Point .45 caliber pistol with a serial #X488320, loaded with one cartridge in the chamber and nine (9) cartridges in the magazine.

There was one .40 caliber S&W cartridge (indicated by cone #1) located on the floor, north of Timothy H. There was one .40 caliber S&W cartridge case (indicated by cone #2) located on the floor east of the Timothy H. There was an orange ear plug located on the floor, south of Timothy H.

Continuing south through the hallway of the office area, were three (3) 7.62 x 39 caliber cartridge casings (indicated by cones #3, #4 and #5) on the floor west of the east wall of office 203. The following damage was also observed inside office 203: there were four (4) bullet holes that penetrated through the east wall, there were six (6) bullet holes that penetrated through the south wall and there were particles of drywall and debris strewn throughout the surfaces of the room. The door to the office had damage near the doorknob, which was determined to be caused during the search of the building by responding officers.

Continuing south through the hallway of the office area, was one 7.62 x 39

caliber cartridge casing (indicated by cone # 6) west of the east wall of office 202. The following damage was also observed inside office 202: there were five (5) bullet holes in the north wall; there were two (2) bullet indentations in a filing cabinet located on the south wall; there were four (4) bullet holes in the south wall and several bullet fragments and copper jacket fragments were located on the floor.

Continuing south through the hallway of the office area there was a slight jog to the west in the hallway. There was an entry/exit door (accessing the southeast parking lot), a small kitchenette area, and a copy machine in the hallway, along the west wall, just west of the east wall of office 200. There were eleven (11) 7.62 x 39 caliber cartridge casings (indicated by cones #7, #8, #9, #10, #11, #12, #13, #16, #17, #18 and #19) on the hallway floor west of the east wall of office 200. There was one 7.62 x 39 caliber cartridge casing (indicated by cone #15) on top of the microwave (on the kitchenette counter). There was one 7.62 x 39 caliber cartridge casing (indicated by cone #14) on hallway floor in front of the men's restroom door, located along the west wall. There were six (6) bullet holes that penetrated through the east wall of the hallway (west interior wall of office 200).

The following damage was also observed inside of office 200: there were six bullet holes that had penetrated through a wooden seven-shelf bookshelf, along the west wall; there were several books and papers that appeared to have previously been on the bookshelf, strewn on the floor with apparent bullet damage; along the east wall was a large window, overlooking the Assembly area, with a bullet hole in the window frame and a bullet hole penetrating the glass; there was a bullet and a copper jacket on the window sill; there was a bullet hole that punctured a three-drawer wooden file cabinet along the south wall with a bullet lodged in the center drawer; there were five (5) copper jackets, four (4) possible bullet cores and two (2) bullet fragments located on the floor and there were particles of drywall debris strewn all over the surfaces of the room.

Continuing south from the office area is a small elevated walkway that accesses the stairway. The stairway descends to the Assembly Area (Building B) and ascends to the Test Room.

The Assembly Area included a vaulted ceiling and an open area with several large (two to three story) industrial generators and other product materials. Along the western wall is an enclosed area of high voltage electrical components, surrounded by an eight foot red metal cyclone fence. East of the enclosed area, on the floor, were three (3) 7.62 x 39 caliber cartridge casings (indicated by cones #20, #21 and #22).

Along the west wall, north of the stairway, from south to north, was an enclosed office area (Assembly Aisle Supervisor Office) that gave access to two additional offices (one to the southwest and one to the northwest).

Along the east interior wall of the outer office, from north to south, was a

metal and glass door and two glass windows with a desk underneath. The southern window was shattered and had multiple bullet holes through it and there was glass and debris covering the desk, chair, and floor of the office. Along the south wall from east to west, was a copy machine and a large file cabinet. Along the west wall, from south to north, is a medical supply cabinet (affixed to the wall) with several boxes and miscellaneous office supplies underneath, a metal and glass door accessing the southwest office, and a metal and glass door accessing the northwest office. There were two (2) bullet holes in the west wall and four (4) bullet holes in the medical cabinet. There were several bullet fragments located inside the cabinet and on the floor below.

The glass in the door of the southwestern office was shattered by multiple bullet holes as well as several bullet holes and indentations in the door. There was a bullet hole through the computer monitor, located on top of the desk. There was glass, debris, and multiple bullet fragments on the floor and surfaces of the office. There was a projectile and five bullet holes in the west wall of the office.

The glass in the door of the northwestern office was shattered and there were multiple bullet holes through the wooden portion of the door. There was glass, debris, and multiple bullet fragments on the floor and surfaces of the office. There were several bullet holes in the west wall of the office.

East of the of the Assembly Aisle Supervisor's Office, on the floor, were seven (7) 7.62 x 39 caliber shell casings (indicated by cones # 23, #24, #25, #26, #27, #28 and #29).

A walk-through of the scene with Lieutenant Deeba, accompanied by Sergeants States and Ruzicka and Detectives Jackson and Sabin, was conducted to establish a basic understanding as to what transpired and to identify any additional items of evidence.

Technicians Dale Pikoraitis, DSN 1541, and Robert Steckhan, DSN 1753, who are both assigned to the Television Section, videotaped the scene at 4350 Semple. The video cassette tape that contained the scene was marked as evidence and later conveyed to the Property Custody Section.

Detective Steven Taubenheim, DSN 6584, assigned to the Computer Crimes Unit, responded to the scene and seized the ABB Company Closed Circuit television computer surveillance system. He later obtained the video images from the Closed Circuit television of subject Timothy H. from the surveillance system.

Detective Taubenheim's investigation as well as information regarding items he seized is incorporated in his supplemental report.

Officers Rodney Thomas, DSN 3100, and Don Reynolds, DSN 4310, who are both assigned to the Evidence Technicians Unit, responded to the scene. At the scene, the officers took the necessary photographs, measurements, and collected

items of evidence, which are incorporated in their supplemental reports.

This concludes the scene investigation.

Homicide Detectives Daniel Fox and Jocelyn Mercier responded to Barnes Hospital and interviewed the following victims relative to the incident at ABB.

Jerry Brown

Brown sustained a single gunshot wound above his right knee. He was listed in stable condition by Dr. Greg Folkert.

Brown informed Detectives Fox and Mercier that prior to the incident he was standing outside the office inside the Repair Building waiting for his daily assignment. Brown stated that there were several other subjects standing with him. Brown identified these employees as Rick Lawrence, Derrick Harris, Vickie Wilson, Tony Edwards, and Darryl (unsure of last name).

Brown advised that he heard a loud bang and looked towards the corner of the building. Upon looking towards the corner of the building near the exterior door, Brown observed a subject, later identified as Timothy H., firing a shotgun in the direction of the group gathered at the office. Brown estimated that Timothy H. was approximately 60-70 feet away from the group when he began firing the shotgun.

Brown stated that the entire group turned and ran away from Timothy H. Brown advised that as he was running away he felt a stinging sensation near his right knee.

Brown stated that he and a group of employees he was with went to the roof to hide. Brown and the group of employees he was with on the roof remained on the roof until police escorted them out of the building. Brown was unsure of who was on the roof with him.

Brown advised that he was unsure who was shooting at him until after the incident. Brown stated that after the incident he heard other employees say that the shooter was Timothy H. Brown did know Timothy H. and stated that he knew no reason as to why Timothy H. would be shooting at him or any other employee at ABB.

Brown added that when he first observed Timothy H., he had a second weapon in a gun sling around his shoulder. Brown stated that he could not remember what clothing Timothy H. was wearing.

Brown informed Detectives Fox and Mercier that the Repair Building is also known as the East Annex Building.

The interview was concluded at that time.

John Green Jr.

Green sustained gunshot wounds to his right forearm and wrist.

Green was in the main building near his supervisor's office when someone came running into the office yelling to call 911. Green observed several other employees leaving the building, so he followed them leaving the main building through the reception area.

As Green was fleeing the building, he heard several loud pops that he believed were gunshots. Green ran to his vehicle that was parked on the employee parking lot. Green started driving north on Semple when he observed a subject standing on the west side of the ABB complex firing shots at his vehicle. Several shots struck Green's vehicle and he received injuries to his right arm.

Green was able to make it to safety and was eventually transported to Barnes hospital for treatment.

Green advised Detectives Fox and Mercier that he could not identify the shooter, but had heard people make mention that the shooter was Timothy H. Green knew Timothy H., but advised that he never got a good look at who was firing shots.

The interview was concluded at that time.

Victims Sharp and Buckley could not be interviewed due to them being in surgery upon Detectives Fox and Mercier's arrival to Barnes.

Victim Keith Garner was transported to Barnes Hospital several hours after the first group was transported. Garner gave a brief statement before being moved for medical treatment.

Keith Garner

Garner advised that he tests large power transformers for ABB. Earlier in the morning, he had just checked one of the transformers and turned to walk away from it. Garner started hearing noises that made him think something was wrong with the transformer, so he returned and turned the power off.

Garner heard other noises that led him to believe that there may be other transformers having problems, therefore; he started turning the power off to all the transformers. As he was turning off the second group of transformers, Garner advised that he was shot.

Garner stated that he did not see who shot him. Garner became dizzy and ended up falling to the floor where he stayed for several hours as he was unable to make it to the door. While lying on the floor, Garner advised that he contacted his wife and told her he had been shot.

After several hours, Garner stated that police officers escorted him from the building and he was transported to the hospital.

The interviews at the hospital concluded at that time.

At approximately 1700 hours, Detective Mercier and Detective Fox contacted Alamo Rental Car relative to a vehicle inside the ABB crime scene. The vehicle was a 2009 Toyota Corolla with a Missouri license of AD8-P8P which had been rented by Hossein Rezai.

Rezai had been interviewed by Detectives at North Patrol Division and allowed to leave prior to Detectives Mercier and Fox being contacted. Detectives Fox and Mercier obtained a statement from Rezai. The following is a synopsis of that statement.

Rezai stated he is self employed as an independent Transformer Consultant and was in town on business consulting at ABB. At approximately 6:30 a.m. he arrived at ABB and was looking for a parking spot near the Winding Room Area when an unknown ABB employee ran from the building yelling, "Get out of here, save yourself. Someone is shooting." Rezai immediately left the parking lot and drove south on Semple. Rezai reached the railroad track area and realized that the street ended there.

He turned around and drove north on Semple. When he neared the parking lot entrance he heard several gunshots. Upon hearing gunshots on Semple, Rezai abandoned the vehicle and ran to a position of safety, toward the railroad tracks and west to a Tire Company where he waited for first responders.

Rezai had been informed by Captain Moran that the vehicle would not be towed and he would be contacted after the scene was secure. Detective Fox made phone contact with Rezai at which time Rezai informed Detective Fox that he lost his eyeglasses while running from the scene and would not be able to drive the vehicle.

Detective Fox contacted Alamo, who advised that Doc's Towing would respond and pick up the vehicle. The vehicle was towed to City Tow per Tow Slip 70554-0, however was then immediately released to Doc's Towing upon arrival as a result no tow reference number was obtained.

It should be noted the following group of ABB employees were conveyed to the North Patrol Division located at 4014 North Union to be interviewed by Police Personnel.

Detective Michael Dohr interviewed ABB employee Lorin Craig Smith.

Lorin Craig Smith

Smith's shift began at 2:00 a.m., he usually works from 6:00 a.m., to 2:30 p.m., however, on January 7, 2010, he was working overtime. At approximately 6:35 a.m., Smith was working in the ABB Assembly Building with about ten to fifteen other employees when an employee named Jeff Ray opened the door in the Assembly building and frantically shouted, "There's a crazy man shooting!" Ray started running toward the exit.

Smith and the other employees started walking towards the exit. Within a minute, he heard several loud gunshots that sounded like they were getting closer to his location. Smith and the other employees exited out of the rear door of the Assembly building. They ran upstairs (as they were on the lower level). Smith heard the gunshots getting closer, as if they were at the bottom of the staircase that they were climbing.

Smith and others exited the building and ran into the employee parking lot. Several employees separated and ran in different directions. Smith ran west along a long fence of the parking lot. Smith and about seven other co-workers cut a hole through the fence with a tool and ran to MFR Tire Service located at 5475 Brown.

Detective Marylyn Johnson interviewed Cihangir Sen.

Cihangir Sen

Sen stated he arrived to work at approximately 6:40 a.m., Sen is a Design Engineer and works in the Engineering Building. As he arrived into the parking lot, he observed several police officers who instructed him to get back into his vehicle. Instead of complying with the officer's instruction, Sen ran inside the building and remained there until he was escorted outside. He did not see or hear any portion of the incident.

Detective Michael Strong interviewed victim Richard Lawrence.

Richard Lawrence

Lawrence said that he arrived at work at 5:30 a.m., for his 6:30 a.m., shift.

Prior to the shooting he was speaking to his employees in the East Annex Building. While speaking to his employees, they heard a loud sound coming from behind them. They all turned to see what caused the noise. He observed the suspect who he believed to be Tim H., described as a white male approximately 48 years old, armed with a shotgun. Lawrence said that Tim H. then fired a shot towards victims Cory Wilson and Darryl Buckley. They all turned and ran north. He was unsure if Wilson or Buckley were struck.

As they were attempting to run for their safety, Tim H. fired shots in their direction. Victim Jerry Brown was struck once in the lower right calf. Lawrence said that they assisted Brown as they ran north from the East Annex Building about 70 yards, where they exited into the courtyard. Lawrence said due to the courtyard having no exits, they fled to the roof for their safety.

He does not know who Tim H. was targeting. Lawrence said that victim Wilson was Tim H.'s supervisor.

Detective Enoch Chambers interviewed witness Kenneth McCellen.

Kenneth McCellen

McCellen stated at approximately 6:30 a.m., he heard 8 to 12 shots. He didn't believe that they were gunshots so he went to investigate. He walked to the Assembly lower level building. He encountered Ed (Identified as victim Edward Lamm, W/M, DOB: 12-25-58), wherein Ed advised him that Timothy H. had just shot at him. He stated that Ed was upset. McCellen looked in the building and observed the rifle end of a gun being held by hands. He stated he did not attempt to see more because he did not want the suspect to make eye contact with him. He stated the suspect was shooting up at the test floor windows.

McCellen and Lamm went to the Materials Receiving building where they stayed for a short time and they each watched a door, looking out for the suspect. They then went to the Annex building to check on another co-worker and they stayed in that building until the police arrived and escorted them off of the property at approximately 8:00 a.m.

McCellen stated he is not an employee of ABB, but is employed with an outside contractor. He stated he has known suspect Timothy H. for approximately two years. He stated Timothy H. appeared to act normal to him in the past. He has never seen him very upset except for the normal complaints that most people make. He stated Timothy H. never gave him any indication that he was going to commit any acts of violence. He stated he did not see Timothy H. in the morning before the incident.

Detective Michael Binz interviewed witnesses Orlando Wade Cohen and Steven Schmidt.

Orlando Wade Cohen

Cohen stated that he arrived to work at ABB Power at approximately 4:50 a.m., and observed Steve Koonce conducting snow removal from the parking lot. He approached him and coordinated the remaining snow removal that needed to be done and went to the maintenance office to get equipment.

Approximately two hours later, he returned to the Maintenance Office to defrost the snow blower that he was using because it was not operating properly. While in the office, he heard two sets of what he believed were gunshots. He could not tell where these shots were coming from.

He described the first set of shots as three shots with one second intervals in between. The second set of gunshots were described as four gunshots with a one second interval in between and a short pause in between both sets.

Another employee, Kevin Rohr, contacted him via cell phone and asked if he heard gun shots. He replied that he did and ended the conversation and hid behind a set of racks that had a view of the only entrance to the maintenance office.

While there, Cohen called Adrian Jones, another employee, who informed him that another employee entered the business and began shooting.

Cohen contacted Jeff Barnes, another employee, who told him that the shooter was Tim H. Cohen described Tim H. as a long time employee who was demoted approximately ten years ago and since then has been moody and believed the company was out to terminate his employment.

Cohen stayed behind the racks and contacted 911 and told the dispatcher where he was located. He waited there until Police Officers safely removed him from the complex.

Steven Schmidt

Schmidt stated that he arrived to work at ABB at approximately 6:15 a.m. Upon his arrival he conducted his normal ritual which consisted of going to the locker room and changing into his work clothes and putting his lunch box in the lunch room.

At approximately 6:30 a.m., an alarm went off that signals the start of the morning meeting located at the "Vapor Phase" near the east door of the Assembly building. At the meeting, he received his daily work assignment, which was number 9721-5 yoking the transformer, near the north end of the Assembly building.

Schmidt stated that he began to walk to his assigned area and passed another employee, Jeff Ray, and said hi and Ray then exited the east door to his work station. Approximately one minute later, Ray ran back through the east door and said that someone just shot at him.

Schmidt continued to walk towards the north end of the building and observed six to eight people trying to get upstairs to the Winding Department when he heard eight to ten shots. He described these shots as not having any specific pattern. A short time later, approximately four to five minutes, he heard what he believed were three to four muffled shots. He could not determine where these shots were coming from.

Schmidt met with Lionel Foster and hid behind the coil oven in the northwest corner of the Assembly building. He called Kirk Dissen, another ABB Power employee, trying to get information on this incident. Dissen told Schmidt that he would inform the police of his location. Schmidt then called his wife (Lori Schmidt) and brother (Ed Schmidt) in an effort to gain more information.

Schmidt contacted Ed Lamm, an ABB Power employee, and gave him his location. Lamm told him to stay there and he would try and get him some help.

Schmidt stated he did not contact "911," because he figured it was already done.

Detective Steven Ortbals interviewed Joe Robey, Ryan Kotler and Darryl Todd.

Joe Robey

Robey stated he was on the 2nd floor of the Office building located in the front of the complex (Building A) near highway 70, at approximately 6:40 a.m., when he heard what he believed to be 2 gunshots. He stated he continued working and did not think the gunshots were near or that they could have been something else. Shortly after the 2 gunshots he heard several more up to 12-15 in close succession. At that time he and his coworkers decided to go to the 3rd floor of the building and lock the doors behind them. Robey stated he did not at any time see anything or know where the shots were coming from.

Ryan Kolter

Kolter stated he was in the "testing room" in Building B and he did not see or hear anything until the police arrived and he was removed from the building.

Darryl Todd

Todd advised that he is currently employed by ABB and is assigned to the "Transformer Repair Department" located in the East Annex building. Todd arrived at his place of employment at 6:03 a.m. He smoked a cigarette prior to meeting with his supervisor at 6:30 a.m. to get his work assignments for the day.

At approximately 6:32 a.m., he heard a loud gunshot that came from the south side of the building. Approximately fifty yards to the south of him, he observed Timothy H. however he did not see him holding a gun. Seconds later, he

heard a second gunshot and saw a muzzle flash close to Timothy H.

Todd ran northwest through the breezeway that is adjoined to a courtyard. Todd and several other employees climbed an access ladder onto the roof and waited for approximately one hour until the scene was rendered safe.

Todd advised that he has known Timothy H. for approximately twenty-five years. He also indicated Timothy H. was upset with the changing company policies and his demotion from supervisor to line worker when the company downsized.

Detective Kurtis McCoy interviewed Edward Lamm and Donald Miller.

Edward Lamm

On January 7, 2010, at 6:15 a.m., Lamm arrived at work and parked his vehicle on the south parking lot. Lamm walked to the Material Control Building, located on the east side of the ABB complex. After entering the Material Control Building, Lamm responded to an office, located on the south side of the Material Control Building, next to the cafeteria. While waiting for his shift to start, at 6:30 a.m., he heard approximately twenty loud bangs coming from the Annex Building. It should be noted that the Annex Building is an adjoining building to the east side of the Material Control Building, accessed by a large entry/exit door.

Lamm exited the office to investigate the noise and observed "Tim H." walking across the floor of the Annex Building. "Tim H." observed Lamm approaching and fired approximately five gunshots at him. Lamm ran to the north end of Material Control and hid behind a stack of radiators. Approximately two minutes later, "Tim H." entered the Material Control Building, walked past Lamm's location without seeing him, and exited the building through the door located on the west side of the Material Control Building. While still in hiding, Lamm called "911" to report the incident.

Lamm assumed that "Tim H." left the immediate area. After approximately two to three minutes passed another employee that Lamm only knows as "Kenny" entered the same entry/exit door on the west side of the building. From his place of hiding, Lamm observed "Kenny" looking out of the windowpane of the door. "Kenny" observed Lamm and asked if he was ok, Lamm replied, "Yeah". Lamm informed "Kenny" of what occurred. Lamm and "Kenny" then positioned themselves where they could watch in different directions for the suspect to return.

Approximately ten minutes later, Lamm heard another voice coming from the maintenance area and called out the name of "Orlando." Orlando responded by saying that the dispatcher wanted all of the employees to respond to the Annex Building and remain in the same area, so he and Kenny responded to the maintenance area. After waiting for about ten to fifteen minutes, Lamm and Kenny decided to inspect the Annex Building. After they left the maintenance area en-route to the Annex Building, the Police located them and escorted them

out of the building through the garage doors on the north end of building.

Donald Miller

On January 7, 2010, at approximately 6:00 a.m., Miller arrived at work and parked his vehicle on the south parking lot just south of the guard station. Miller entered the Winding Building through an entry/exit door and responded to the Assembly Area for the morning meeting and daily job assignments. The meeting started at approximately 6:30 a.m., and lasted until approximately 6:38 a.m.

Following the meeting, Miller responded to his work station in the Assembly Area, when almost immediately, everyone (approximately fifteen people) in the Assembly Area hurried towards him up the stairwell that led to the Winding Building. One of the employees was motioning for everyone to make their way up the stairwell, at which time Miller followed. When he was approximately half way up the stairwell, Miller heard several gunshots emanating from the Assembly Area. Miller stated that after he reached the top of the stairs he responded to the Saw Room seeking cover. Approximately one minute later, Miller observed, through one of the entry/exit door windowpanes, a large framed male wearing brown coveralls and carrying a dark colored assault rifle.

Miller did not hear or see anything further. While in the Saw Room, Miller said that he called his supervisor, Terry Mabry, however he did not receive an answer. Miller then called "911" to report the incident. Miller remained in the Saw Room until the arrival of Police personnel. He was later escorted out of the Saw Room through the north door of the Winding Building.

Detective Ja-Mes Davis interviewed Derrick Harris.

Derrick Harris

Harris stated that he arrived to work at the Annex at 6:15 a.m. After changing his shoes it was about 6:30 a.m., when he met with his co-workers and manager as they normally do for their daily work assignments. He heard the alarm bell which sounds at the start and end of his shift (6:30 a.m., to 2:40 p.m.) Their meeting lasted about five minutes. As they were preparing to disperse to their daily assignments, he heard what he describes as a loud boom come from the inside of the Annex.

Seconds later, he heard about ten gunshots coming from the south end bay doors. He and several of his co-workers, "Jerry", who was shot in the leg and Tony Edwards, all ran out of the building down a breezeway until they reached the courtyard. Once they reached the courtyard, they climbed up a ladder onto the roof of what he believed to be the administration building.

They remained on the roof for about forty five minutes to an hour. While on the roof, they heard numerous gunshots and observed some other co-workers, Rick

Lawrence, "Darryl," Bill Shaw, and "Maury" hiding on the roof. He stated from the sound of the gunshots, he could tell that the shooter was no longer in the Annex Building. Someone called Rick Lawrence on his (Rick Lawrence's) cellular telephone wherein "Rich" opened a door from the roof and everyone entered the administration building from the third floor. He stated after about five or six minutes the police entered the building and escorted them to a Metro bus. He stated that he was not injured during this incident.

Detective Andrew Greenman interviewed witness Grayling Harris, Stanley Hatch, Donald Puder and Kevin Podolski.

Grayling Harris

Harris stated he was in the South Assembly locker room when he heard what was later determined to be gunfire. Believing it was a transformer in the plant "popping," Harris walked out of the locker room where he was told by an unknown individual that someone was in the building shooting. At this time Harris began running.

Harris previously worked for Timothy H. and he did not see Timothy H. or his vehicle today.

Harris advised that Timothy H. had been extremely anti-social the last year, avoiding contact with fellow employees. He indicated that he was unsure of the exact cause of the change in his (Timothy H.) personality.

Stanley Hatch

Hatch advised he was sitting in his office, located on the second level of the Administration building, when a co-worker, Wes Elliot, entered and advised him that he needed to run. Hatch ran to the third floor of the Administration building and waited for the Police Department to arrive. Hatch stated he did not hear or see anything.

Hatch stated he has been in his current position for only a few weeks and does not know most of the employees, including Timothy H.

Donald Puder

Puder received a phone call advising him that there was someone in the East Annex shooting people. Puder immediately ducked down in the northeast corner on an exterior wall. Puder advised while ducking down, he heard gunshots on the opposite side of the exterior wall coming from the approximate area of the storage lot. Puder advised he could hear the gunshots move into the South Assembly area on the opposite side of an interior wall near by. The gunshots then moved south to where he believed was the South Parking Lot. Puder heard approximately twenty gunshots.

Detective Greenman displayed a photograph of subject Timothy H. to Puder. When asked by Detective Greenman, Puder stated he has known Timothy H. for approximately twenty years and did not see him today. Puder did not know what type of vehicle Timothy H. owned.

Puder advised Timothy H. has been anti-social for a while. On one occasion, Puder advised a co-worker had touched Timothy H. on the shoulder and Timothy H. began yelling that he was being sexually harassed. Puder stated that he has heard employees in the past indicate, and he has believed for some time, that Timothy H. was capable of doing something like this. Puder could not provide any information regarding a possible motive for Timothy H.'s actions.

Kevin Podolski

Podolski stated he was in the Winding Building when he heard people yelling that someone was in the building shooting. Podolski heard approximately four gunshots and immediately ran towards a door located on the western side of the building. Podolski exited, along with several other employees and turned southbound. Podolski continued running south toward the train tracks. While running, Podolski advised he heard an additional twenty-five to thirty gunshots. Podolski advised he did not see who was firing the shots and could not give a location where they were being fired from.

Detective Greenman displayed a photograph of subject Timothy H. to Podolski. When asked by Detective Greenman, Podolski stated he has known Timothy H. for thirty years and considers him a close friend. Podolski stated he and Timothy H. work in separate buildings and he would rarely see Timothy H. at work. He did not see Timothy H. or his vehicle today.

Timothy H. kept to himself and was prone to outbursts of anger. Podolski stated Timothy H. often talked to him about hunting and guns. Podolski also advised that he has believed for a long time that Timothy H. was capable of doing something like this.

Detective Scott Paiva interviewed Ryan Wagner.

Ryan Wagner

He stated that he was standing just inside the south end of the Winding Building, near machine #13, when he heard something outside that sounded like a snowplow, plowing the parking lot, but the noise seemed to be strangely louder. He said that he went outside, and began to walk north along the Winding Building, when an unknown male yelled to him to take cover, because that sound was gunfire. Wagner stated that he reentered the Winding Building and noticed that the air was smoky, and smelled of gunpowder. He advised that he immediately hid underneath one of the machines (described as a fifteen foot hole in the ground, located under a winding machine, which is used to wind wire onto a large spool). Wagner said that he did not see anyone or hear anything else

regarding this incident.

Detective Donald Thurmond interviewed witnesses Juan Lopez, Richard Phillips, and Lionel Foster.

Juan Lopez

Lopez stated he arrived at work at 6:20 a.m., and walked to the Annex Building which is located on the east side of the property. Lopez was in the break room on the north side of the Annex Building getting coffee when he heard 8-10 gunshots. Two males (no further), who were in the break room with Lopez left to discover the origin of the noise. After the two males exited the break room, Lopez observed them running toward the exit of the building.

Lopez heard two more gunshots and took cover underneath a table. Lopez looked out of the break room, while underneath the table, and observed a white male (he described as approximately 5'10, 200 lbs, short brown hair, mustache, wearing a beige hat, beige shirt, and a beige coat tied around his waste) exit the building holding a long brown rifle. After approximately three minutes, Lopez crawled from underneath the table, looked around, and did not observe anyone in the area. Lopez walked out of the break room and observed an individual standing outside of the break room. Lopez did not know the individual's name; however he walked with him to the maintenance room where they met with three other individuals. Lopez and the other four individuals stayed inside of the maintenance room for approximately 20-30 minutes until the police came and escorted them out.

Richard Phillips

Phillips stated he arrived at work at approximately 6:30 a.m. He walked inside the Main Office Building, (Building A), which is located on Bircher on the north side of the property. Phillips walked to his desk, which is located on the south side of the building at which time he heard two gunshots. After hearing the gunshots he looked out of his window, which is facing south, and looked west across the property. Phillips heard seven to nine more gunshots and observed a white vehicle make a u-turn on Semple. The vehicle drove north towards Bircher.

Phillips advised that he stayed in his office until he found out what was going on. He received a phone call from a co-worker, Rick Lawrence, who advised him that he was on the roof of Building A hiding. Phillips opened a door to let Lawrence and two other individuals inside of the building. Phillips, Lawrence, and the other two individuals stayed inside of the building until the Police arrived and escorted them from the property.

Lionel Foster

Foster stated he arrived at work at 6:15 a.m., and walked inside the Winding

Building which is located on the west side of the property. The Winding Building is connected to the Main Assembly Aisle Building and Foster advised that he walked through the Winding Building to get to the Main Assembly Aisle building where he works.

Foster went to his morning meeting where he received his job assignment. While in his meeting a co-worker, Jeff Ray, entered the Main Assembly Aisle Building and advised him and his co-workers that someone just shot at him. Foster then heard approximately five gunshots at which time he and Steve Smith, another co-worker, ran to another room which is located on the south side of the building and hid behind an oven. Foster then heard fifteen to twenty more gunshots which appeared to be getting further away from his location. Foster remained in hiding until the Police arrived and escorted him out.

Detective Leonard Blansitt interviewed William E. Shaw

William E. Shaw

Shaw stated that he arrived at work at approximately 6:10 a.m. He stated at approximately 6:30 a.m., he was standing outside the supervisor's office in the East Annex when he heard two gunshots. He turned and observed a subject, who he recognized as Timothy H., standing approximately 70 feet away holding a shotgun. He ran out of the building into the courtyard. While outside of the building, he heard numerous gunshots coming from the building. He and several other subjects climbed a ladder to the roof of another building and waited for the police.

He stated that he has known the suspect for approximately 25 years and for the last six months the suspect has been acting very despondent and unapproachable.

Detective Kurt Battig interviewed John E. Long III and Maury J. Bingham.

John E. Long III

At approximately 6:35 a.m., Long was at his machine working when he saw several of his co-workers running up the stairs (from the first floor) to the west exit door. As they ran past him (Long,) they told him that someone was shooting and to get out of the building. Long followed his co-workers to the west door, out of the building, and into the parking lot.

As he was running to the door, he heard four to five gunshots that sounded like they were coming from the first floor. Long exited the door and he heard ten to fifteen more gunshots. Long, Jay Long and a female security guard (name unknown) ran to his car, described as a 1999, white, Chevy Blazer, which was parked in the lot. They sat in his car for a few minutes. Long did not have the keys to the car with him and he heard several more gunshots that sounded like they were getting closer. Fearing that the shooter was getting closer, Long, Jay Long and the security officer ran from the vehicle.

While running from the vehicle, Long saw supervisor Matt Elder and Steve Sharp dragging what appeared to be someone who was shot across the parking lot. John Long, Jay Long and the security officer then ran to a building that contained large tanks (the tank farm) and hid behind several pipes for about 45 minutes to an hour, until a Police Officer found them and led them to the Metro bus.

While on the bus, Long heard that the shooter was "Tim" from the pre-fit department. Long knew "Tim" in passing but never had any lengthy conversation with him.

Maury J. Bingham

At approximately 6:40 a.m., Bingham was in his office located in the East Annex building working on the computer when he heard what sounded like someone hammering on metal pipes in rapid succession (about 20 times). At about the same time, Bingham's co-worker, Don Wilson who was in the same office with him received a phone call from Vickie (Wilson's wife). Vicki, who also works at ABB and was on duty, told Wilson that someone was on the property shooting and he needed to get out of the building.

Bingham and Wilson ran out of the west door into the courtyard. Once outside, Bingham lost sight of Wilson, however he saw another co-worker "Bill" who told him that someone was inside the building shooting people. Bingham heard ten or more gunshots once he was outside. Bingham and Bill made their way to the roof of another building and hid there with five other co-workers (Don, Darryl Todd, Rick Lawrence, and Derrick Harris) until Police Officers arrived and escorted them to a bus.

Once on the bus Bingham heard that the shooter was "Tim." Bingham has known "Tim" for the past twenty years, but only as a working relationship. There was nothing to indicate that "Tim" might be capable of doing this.

Homicide Detective Jimmy Hyatt interviewed Sue Schaffer and Antonio Edwards.

Sue Schaffer

Schaffer advised the Detective that on the day of the shooting she was standing in the "Winding Department," when she heard ten to fifteen gunshots and people yelling there was a "shooter." She advised she and another employee ran out the west door of the "Winding Department" and down the alley to the parking lot, where her car was located. When she entered her vehicle she realized she did not have her keys. She stated she then got out of her car along with "Kevin Podolski" and she observed someone lying on the ground in between the "Winding" building and the office building. She stated someone else was standing over the person on the ground. She further advised she did not know who either person was.

Schaffer stated the guard then let her in her car where they proceeded to the end of the parking lot where they got stuck on ice. She stated they exited the car and ran up the railroad tracks to MFR Tire to seek safety along with seven other ABB employees.

Schaffer stated she had overheard the shooters name was Tim H. whom she has known for thirty years or so. She further stated she never saw anyone with a gun.

This concluded the interview with Sue Schaffer.

Antonio Edwards

Edwards advised the Detective that he has been employed with ABB for approximately 22 years. At approximately 6:35 a.m., while in the "Annex" (main aisle) he heard a shotgun blast. Edwards stated he is a hunter and knew the sound came from a shotgun. He further advised when he heard the blast; he turned and observed a "man with a gun."

He advised the shooter was approximately twenty yards away from him and he was unsure of the identity of the shooter. After the first gunshot, there was a slight pause and then two more gunshots, at which time he was running for safety. Edwards added that a man from his group got shot in the leg at that point.

Edwards was asked if he knew the person responsible for the shooting, at which time he stated he did not see the shooter however, overheard who the shooter was. Detective Hyatt asked Edwards if the identity of the shooter was surprising. Edwards advised that the shooter (Timothy H.) has been going through some "issues" in the past year.

Timothy H. used to be his supervisor and they used to speak to each other, but in the past year they have become estranged. Edwards went on to say that he would say hello to Timothy H. and he would just look at him not saying anything. Edwards advised that at one point, Timothy H. told him that someone from ABB was coming to his (Timothy H.'s) house and "messing" with his cars and house. Edwards stated he advised Timothy H. that he did not think anyone would do such a thing.

Edwards advised the Detective that he would not be able to confidently say that the person he saw with the shotgun was Timothy H.

This concluded the interview with Antonio Edwards.

Detective Hyatt conducted a follow up interview with Darryl Todd

Todd advised the Detective that he was in the "Annex" portion of the building, along with Vickie Wilson, Derrick Harris, Rick Lawrence, Bill Shaw, Antonio Edwards and Jerry Brown, getting job assignments when he heard a loud boom. He advised he looked down the aisle towards the (south) door and observed a man standing down there, and then observed a "muzzle flash." He advised at that point he turned and ran.

Todd never got a good look at the suspect's face because he was approximately fifty yards away. He did not see which door the suspect came in as there are two main doors at that end of the building.

He heard two shots and then ran to the north-west corner of the building and exited near the paint booth to an alley where he located an access ladder to the roof. Once on the roof, Todd dialed 911 and spoke to an "Amanda."

When asked who was on the roof, Todd stated Vicky Wilson did not join him on the roof but Don Wilson and Maury Bingham did. He stated Wilson and Bingham were previously working at the other end of the Annex.

Detective Hyatt asked Todd if anyone in his group was struck by gunfire, at which time Todd advised Jerry Brown was struck in the leg.

Detective Hyatt asked if it appeared the shooter was aiming at anyone in particular or if he believed the shooter to be firing randomly.

Todd stated the morning meeting at the other end of the building was taking place near the office and it appeared the gunfire was directed towards the group meeting.

Todd further stated once he was on the roof, he heard "a lot" of shooting still going on and it appeared to be coming from inside the building.

Todd was adamant that he would not be able to identify the shooter as Timothy H.

This concluded the interview with Darryl Todd.

Detective Heather Sabin conducted a follow up interview with Rick Lawrence.

Rick Lawrence

Lawrence stated he is a supervisor in the repair department of ABB and has been employed by the company for thirty-three years. On today's date, he arrived for work in the East Annex Building of the business at approximately 5:30 a.m. His shift started at 6:30 a.m. but he arrived early to read e-mails and make coffee prior to his shift.

He held a meeting just outside his office starting at 6:30 a.m., to give the personnel working for him their assignments for the day. Lawrence stated the

morning meeting was a daily occurrence. He was giving assignments to Darryl Todd, Bill Shaw, Vickie Wilson, Derrick Harris, Jerry Brown and Tony Edwards. He saw Cory Wilson, the other supervisor outside his (Wilson's) office as well (south of where he was standing). Lawrence stated he only saw Darryl Buckley standing with Wilson and thought most of Wilson's people must have called off work that day.

Lawrence stated a few minutes into the meeting he heard one gunshot from a shotgun and turned toward the noise. He saw Timothy H. standing inside the doorway with a shotgun in his hands. Timothy H. turned toward Wilson, fired a second gunshot from the shotgun and then turned toward his direction and began firing several more gunshots at them. Lawrence stated his entire group, except for Vickie Wilson, along with two other workers from another section, Maury Bingham and Don Wilson, ran out an exterior door on the west side of the building, into a courtyard. The courtyard was enclosed on all sides so the group climbed a ladder onto the roof of the building. When they got to the roof, Brown advised them he had been shot. Lawrence stated they attempted to wrap Brown's wound with clothing. Todd had a cell phone. He called 911 and advised the evaluator of their location and that they had a wounded person.

Lawrence stated he could hear multiple gunshots that sounded as if they were coming from the alleyway west of the building and going into the Winding/ Assembly building. He stated they waited on the roof for an unknown amount of time, until the gunshots stopped. They contacted another employee in the building and asked them to open an exterior door that led from the third floor offices to the roof, as the door was locked. They were let in through the doorway and encountered uniformed officers that escorted them out of the building.

Lawrence stated Timothy H. was wearing a brown canvass type jacket and brown pants (possibly overalls). He has known Timothy H. for about 25 or 30 years, since he (Timothy H.) began working for the company. He added he and his wife used to have dinner together with Timothy H. and his wife and were friends several years ago. Lawrence advised that Cory Wilson was the supervisor for Timothy H., Charlie Poe, and Darryl Buckley.

About eight or nine years ago, Timothy H. was a supervisor for the company and was demoted from his position back to the floor. Lawrence stated he did not know the exact reason for the demotion, but afterwards Timothy H. seemed disgruntled and agitated much of the time. Timothy H. was no longer sociable with anyone in the company including him and kept to himself.

Lawrence agreed to have his statement recorded. The statement was recorded on a digital recorder and later transferred to CD. The CD was packaged as evidence and a copy placed in the homicide tape file per file number 6273.

Detective Sabin interviewed Brian Millikin and Nicholas Pusateri

Brian Millikin

Millikin stated he was driving to work at ABB; however, was running late due to the bad weather. He arrived at Bircher and Union and was stopped by a uniformed officer and advised that he would have to leave the area and respond to the North Patrol Station. Millikin stated he never entered the scene.

Nicholas Pusateri

Pusateri stated he was riding to work with Millikin. They arrived at Bircher and Union and were advised by police officers that they could not enter the area. Pusateri stated they never entered the scene.

Homicide Detective Charles Betts interviewed Gary Goodwin and Mark Campbell.

Gary Goodwin

Victim Goodwin stated at approximately 6:30 a.m., he and other ABB employees had just finished a morning meeting and were walking within the "Assembly" area of the business, near the "VAPO Pit."

Suddenly, various ABB employees began entering the "Assembly" area, frantically notifying everyone in the immediate area that an unknown subject was firing a weapon outside of the building.

Goodwin and several other ABB employees ran up a stairwell into the "Winding" area of the business. Unsure of the exact location of the "shooter," Goodwin waited at a perimeter door, located on the west side of the "Winding" area. Hearing shots now coming from the "Assembly" area, Goodwin, along with other ABB employees, exited the building via the western perimeter door and ran south toward the "main gate."

Upon reaching the main gate, Goodwin observed a white male subject exit the "Winding" area via the western perimeter door. Goodwin described the white male as being clad in a brown coat, jeans, and holding a black assault rifle. The unknown subject began firing the assault rifle toward vehicles traveling in the 4300 block of Semple Avenue. The unknown suspect then turned and began walking toward Goodwin's location.

Fearing that he would be shot if he attempted to run west across Semple Avenue, Goodwin ran south through the parking lot. While running, he observed two ABB employees dragging an injured third employee out of the "Assembly" area. The two unknown employees were forced to leave the injured third employee near the perimeter of the southwest side of the "Assembly" building, because of the approaching unknown suspect.

Goodwin sought cover in the area of the oil tanks located on the southeastern portion of the parking lot. Prior to reaching the tanks he heard the sounds of

projectiles passing him within close proximity.

While concealed near the oil tanks, Goodwin believed the unknown suspect ran out of rifle ammunition and switched his weapon to a smaller caliber firearm, possibly a pistol. Being an experienced hunter, Goodwin came to this conclusion because he noted a difference in the sound of the shots being fired.

It should be noted, Goodwin never observed the unknown suspect changing weapons or firing anything other than the assault rifle.

Goodwin was unable to identify the suspect he observed shooting as Timothy H. because he never was able to get a good look at the suspect's face.

Mark Campbell

Witness Campbell stated at approximately 6:30 A.M., he and other ABB employees were attending a morning meeting near the supervisor's office located within the "Assembly" area of the business.

Suddenly, an ABB employee named Jeff, also known to Witness Campbell as "Stickman," entered the "Assembly Area," frantically notifying everyone in the immediate area that an unknown subject was firing a weapon outside of the building.

Witness Campbell and several other ABB employees ran up a stairwell into the "Winding" area of the business and exited the building via the western perimeter door. He and other employees ran south toward the "main gate" seeking cover within the parking lot just south of the "Winding" building.

Upon reaching the parking lot and concealing himself behind a truck, Witness Campbell observed a white male subject, known to him as Timothy H. exit the "Winding Area" via the western perimeter door. Timothy H. began firing an assault rifle toward a vehicle which was traveling north in the 4300 block of Semple Avenue.

After firing multiple rounds at the vehicle, Timothy H. turned and began walking south toward the parking lot. Observing Timothy H. approaching, Witness Campbell ran toward the eastern perimeter of the parking lot to seek a new position of cover.

While seeking cover Witness Campbell observed Victim Mabry being carried out of the south side of the "Assembly" building by Witness Elder and a second unknown ABB employee. Witness Elder and the second unknown ABB employee were forced to leave Victim Mabry near the southwest corner of the "Assembly" building because Timothy H. was approaching.

Witness Campbell was crouched down on his hands and knees behind a vehicle which was parked near the eastern perimeter of the parking lot. While crouched down,

he observed Timothy H. approach Victim Mabry, standing almost directly over him, and fire an assault rifle at the victim approximately two times. Timothy H. then leaned down near Victim Mabry's face, screamed at him, and then shot him approximately three more times with the assault rifle.

Timothy H. then began firing approximately ten to fifteen shots from the assault rifle at the security guard office located on the parking lot. Timothy H. then turned and shouted, "Where the fuck you going pig!", as he fired the assault rifle at Victim Sharp, II. Witness Campbell observed Victim Sharp, II running southbound through the parking lot as Timothy H. fired the assault rifle. Victim Sharp, II subsequently fell to the ground suffering from an apparent gunshot wound.

Witness Campbell observed Timothy H. walk slowly north through the parking lot, passing the security guard office, where Witness Campbell lost sight of the suspect.

After losing sight of the suspect, witness Campbell waited for a short duration of time and then fled the parking lot with other ABB employees, running south to the railroad tracks. Upon reaching the railroad track, the employees ran west to the rear of MFR Tire Services, Inc., located at 5475 Brown Avenue.

MFR employees provided shelter for the ABB employees until arrival of the Police Department.

Detective Jerone T. Jackson interviewed Cordin Hudson and Charles Poe.

Cordin Hudson

Hudson stated he is employed by Securitas Security Company having security officer license number 65202 issued on July 31, 2009, and expiring on August 1, 2010. He is currently assigned to the ABB campus which is an unarmed post. On January 7, 2010, his duty hours were from 12:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m.

Hudson stated he completed his roving patrol and returned to the guard shack located on the west side of the building on the south parking lot. While looking at the surveillance monitor he observed employees running from the building. He stepped outside the guard shack and saw employees running and heard them yelling, "He shooting."

Moments later he observed a subject he described as an unknown male approximately 5'07, 170 to 180 pounds, wearing a dark cap, brown coat holding a long gun in both hands. He observed the armed subject raise the gun to eye level and began firing at ABB employees as they ran across the parking lot.

The armed subject observed Hudson who was wearing his security officer uniform and began firing gunshots in his direction. Hudson entered the guard shack and dialed 911. His supervisor Security Officer Janisha Johnson ran from the guard

shack to her vehicle.

Hudson heard several more gunshots and some entered the guard shack. Hudson got on the floor and waited for the gunshots to cease. Hudson got up and could not locate the gunman. He left the guard shack and observed a victim lying on the parking lot bleeding from the head. Hudson stated he was unable to identify the gunman because he had a black mask over the lower portion of his face.

Detective Jackson concluded the interview with Hudson.

Charles Poe

Poe stated he arrived at work at the East Annex Building at approximately 6:20 a.m., and entered through the southwest door. He was standing near the offices located along the eastern wall of the building waiting for his daily assignment from his supervisor.

Poe heard a loud gunshot fired south of his location near the entrance. He looked in that direction and observed an armed subject firing a gun. Poe ran west out of the line of fire and hid between the walls in a covered and enclosed walkway, located along the western wall of the Annex Building. As he was running, he observed several other ABB employees doing the same. While in hiding he continued to hear multiple gunshots and observed bullet holes in the wall near his location and assumed that the armed subject was shooting at him.

Poe ran south along the covered and enclosed walkway and exited the East Annex Building through the door located at the southwest corner of the building. Poe ran to his vehicle, got in, and immediately left the area responding to his residence. Poe attempted to call employees to check on their well being and to discover what happened after he left. Employees he contacted were unable to provide any answers to his questions.

Poe stated he was unable to see the subject's face who was firing the gun and he was later advised that the gunman was Timothy H.

Detective Jackson concluded the interview with Charles Poe.

Detective Lloyd White interviewed ABB employee Wesley Elliott, Juan Gonzalez Lopez and Vickie Wilson.

Wesley Elliott

Victim Wesley Elliott stated he is employed by ABB, Inc. Elliott stated he just walked out of the morning meeting and began working in the Assembly Building near a vapor pit. Elliott observed a shift supervisor, victim Terry Mabry, on his cellular phone stating he is calling 911. He could not figure out what was going on as he saw co-workers standing around with a puzzled look on their faces. Elliott went outside and saw a co-worker named "Osie" standing by the

side exit door. Usually when someone calls 911, someone must have fallen or gotten hurt. Elliott walked to "Osie" and inquired about what was going on and "Osie" told him that they were just told that someone was over in the East Annex shooting.

Moments later, Elliott observed an individual come out from between the radiators and flip up an assault rifle and fire two shots at him and "Osie." Elliott and "Osie" ran back into the Assembly building for safety and knew the individual that was shooting was coming in the door behind them. Elliott ran toward the lunch room and he heard a first shift supervisor, Matt Elder, tell other employees to run upstairs to the Winding Area and he did not see where "Osie" ran. Elliott stated he yelled out to everyone to hurry, because the shooter is coming through the side door. He and approximately twenty co-workers ran up the stairs to the Winding Area.

He made it to the top of the stairs to the entrance of the Winding Area, when he heard six to eight shots, then a pause in shots, then he heard approximately ten to twenty additional shots that continued for fifteen to twenty seconds. The pause appeared long enough that he believed the shooter had to reload after the first six to eight shots that he heard previously.

Elliott ran to the opposite end of the Winding Area toward Building A and saw a guy shoveling snow. Elliott informed him that there was a shooter in the building and that he needs to protect himself and get inside the building. Elliott and the guy shoveling snow went to Building A, at which time Elliott began yelling out to whoever was in the building. He located an employee named Stan Hatch, who was sitting at his desk. Elliott told Hatch to get his coat and to go to the third floor, because the third floor could be secured by a key pad and the shooter could not gain access. Everyone waited on the third floor until the police arrived.

Elliott was later informed that the shooter was "Tim," but he did not have a clear view of the shooter's face, because the shooter's face was obscured by the rifle. Elliott indicated the shooter had the same build and mannerism as "Tim" but could not say specifically that the shooter was indeed "Tim." The shooter was described as a white male, age unknown, and clean shaven, 5'10 ft, wearing a white jacket, a dark ball cap, and snow type boots. While on the Metro bus that conveyed him and other ABB employees to the North Patrol Division Station, he heard people say they saw Timothy H. do the shooting. He does not remember who stated that they saw Timothy H. shooting.

Elliott believed that the incident occurred around 6:30 a.m.

Elliott advised that Timothy H. has been acting "extreme" for the last couple of years. Timothy H. would have mood swings and acts hostile and aggressive toward everyone. One day Timothy H. will be nice to you and the next day he acts if he wants to kill you. Elliott has known Timothy H. for nearly thirty years as an employee of ABB. Elliott indicated that Timothy H. was once a

supervisor at ABB, but that position was taken away from him and he (Timothy H.) began acting moody ever since that happened. When the supervisor position opened again, Timothy H. was passed over and Elliott believes that the person that was shot in the Annex building was the person who got Timothy H.'s former supervisor position.

Elliott's interview was recorded on digital recorder and later placed on a CD. The CD was placed in the Homicide Audio File under file number 5969. An additional copy of the CD was packaged and placed in the Property Room as evidence.

Juan Gonzalez Lopez

Witness Juan Lopez stated he does not work for ABB, but was hired through Jani King, a janitorial service to clean ABB facilities. Lopez was in the lunch room located inside the Annex building drinking a cup of coffee and heard approximately ten shots. Lopez saw a white male, approximately fifty years old, wearing beige clothing with a hat, nothing further. He saw this subject walking through the building and he was carrying a long dark brown gun and looking around. As the subject was walking toward his direction, he (Lopez) immediately turned out the lights in the lunch room and hid under a table for approximately ten minutes.

After ten minutes passed, he eventually came out and looked for the subject and saw that the subject was gone. Lopez stated some of his co-workers (Jani King) came and got him out of the lunch room and took him to the Material building, where they all stayed together until the police arrived.

Lopez did not see anyone get shot and could not described the subject's face.

Lopez's interview was recorded on digital recorder and later placed on a CD. The CD was placed in the Homicide Audio File under file number 5972. An additional copy of the CD was packaged and placed in the Property Room as evidence.

Vickie Wilson

Witness Vickie Wilson stated she is an employee of ABB and was in the Annex Building attending their morning meeting when she heard a big bang and saw a man coming around a tank at the entrance of the building with a gun. The subject continued to fire the gun and she saw her son, Cory Wilson, run into his office. All her co-workers who were standing in the aisles began running. Wilson was standing in front of her supervisor's, Rick Lawrence, office and hid in Lawrence's office next to a file cabinet. Wilson heard multiple gunshots.

Wilson called her husband, Donald Wilson, who works in the back of the building and told him to get out of the building. Wilson then called 911. Wilson also called the Assembly supervisor, Terry Mabry.

The subject that she saw shooting was a white male, approximately 5'10ft and 195lbs, wearing a beige coat, jacket or a shirt. Wilson does not know what type of gun the subject was carrying, but it appeared to be a long gun, which he held down by his side.

Wilson advised the Detectives that the subject was approximately 60 feet away from her group as he began shooting in their direction. Wilson believed she heard at least one hundred gunshots.

Wilson did not actually know the identity of the subject who was shooting, but thought the subject resembled Timothy H.

Wilson's son, Cory Wilson, was standing by the front entrance of the Annex Building with his employees near the area where the subject came through the entrance shooting. While she was hiding in the office, she remembers hearing the gunshots stop for a moment and then start again. Wilson believes the subject was reloading. Wilson stated she was talking to Terry Mabry on the cellular telephone while the shooting was going on. Wilson called a manager in the Manufacture building and he told her to stay where she is and try to turn off the lights and that the police have arrived.

Wilson did not see anyone get shot by the subject during the shooting, but after the shooting was over, she saw that Darrell Buckley, an employee who was supervised by her son, "Cory," had gunshot wounds to his legs and stomach and he appeared to be bleeding everywhere.

Wilson's husband, Donald Wilson, arrived to her location but he was being held back by the police. A police sergeant allowed her husband to go into "Cory's" office, at which time her husband told her that her son, "Cory," was shot in the head.

Wilson's interview was recorded on digital recorder and later placed on a CD. The CD was placed in the Homicide Audio File under file number 5973. An additional copy of the CD was packaged and placed in the Property Room as evidence.

6458, responded to the Triad Company located at 4321 Semple and interviewed ABB and Triad employees who were relocated from the scene.

Detective Michael Dohr interviewed Jim Lee Warren, Suzanne Ellen Watson, John Edwards Burcks, Staci Rae Hill and Dennis Darrel Bain.

Jim Lee Warren

Warren, who is employed at Triad, stated he arrived at work at about 6:05 a.m. His office is on the second floor and it faces Semple. Around 6:30 a.m., Warren heard a commotion, which sounded like four to five distinct voices yelling. Warren assumed it was Triad employees joking with each other; however, about 30-60 seconds later, he heard approximately 25 loud gunshots that sounded like they came from a semi-automatic weapon.

It sounded like the gunshots were being fired in a southern direction, as if the shooter were walking south on Semple. Warren ducked for cover, he did not look out of the window. He located another manager, Dave Heath, and they went downstairs to the main assembly floor. The maintenance employees locked the facility down. At no time did Warren see the shooter.

Suzanne Ellen Watson

Watson, who is employed at Triad, arrived for work at 6:00 a.m. Her office is on the ground floor facing Semple and ABB. Around 6:30 a.m., Watson heard a commotion but she did not think it was arguing. Seconds later, she heard about 6 loud gunshots that sounded like they were coming from Semple. She peaked out of her window and saw the taillights of two vehicles driving north on Semple.

More gunshots were heard, and then a co-worker, Mark Bowles, came into her office and told her to get down. Watson crouched down in safety. When there was a pause in the shots, she and Bowles ran to the main assembly floor for safety and initiated a facility lockdown.

John Edwards Burcks

Burcks, who is employed at Triad, arrived at work at 6:00 a.m. His office is located on the ground floor just south of the main assembly area. Burcks stated he was sitting at his desk when he saw two ABB employees, Greg, and an unknown black female, running into his work area carrying their hard hats. Burcks asked them, "What's the problem" and they told him that someone was shooting at ABB.

Burcks stated, apparently these two ABB employees entered the Triad building through the receiving docks, which are to the east of Burcks' office. One of Triad's employees must have let them in, as these doors are usually locked. Burcks ran toward the receiving docks, and heard six loud gunshots that sounded like they were coming from Semple.

Staci Rae Hill

Hill, who is employed at Triad, arrived at her office located on the ground floor at 6:15 a.m. Her office faces the south, so she does not have a window that faces Semple. At approximately 6:30 a.m. Hill heard an overhead page for Maintenance, and the individual speaking on the page system sounded troubled. Hill heard six loud gunshots outside the building. Russ Illy, the Human Resources manager, advised employees to go to the main assembly room for safety.

Dennis Darrel Bain

Bain was shoveling snow in front of the employee entrance doors of Triad (facing Semple) when he observed twenty to thirty people running from the ABB building. He shouted to the people, and one told him that there was a man shooting at ABB. He then heard about thirty gunshots, and ran inside the Triad building. Bain did not see the suspect or hear any gunshots.

Detective Michael Shaw interviewed Triad employees Jean Malloy and Amen Sabbagh.

Jean Malloy

Malloy stated she was working on the dock with Robert Lawrence at approximately 6:30 to 6:40 a.m., when two black females and three white males from the ABB building ran into the side entrance door and said, "Someone was shooting across the street."

Jean indicated that she and Robert ran around to the other dock door and observed an unknown male carrying an unknown type of weapon shooting at the ABB building. After Jean and Robert observed the subject shooting they ran back into the building and advised the other employees to hide because someone was shooting across the street.

Amen Sabbagh

Sabbagh stated he heard two gunshots from across the street, and observed several people running from the ABB building.

Detective James Thayer interviewed Triad employees Mark Bowles and Allen Grothe.

Mark Bowles

Bowles stated he arrived at Triad Manufacturing at approximately 5:50 a.m. and entered the front office of Triad. Between 6:15 a.m. and 6:30 a.m., Bowles indicated he observed several subjects running and screaming on the ABB parking lot and Semple. He exited the building where he observed a maintenance man (Dennis) shoveling snow and asked what was going on. Dennis advised Bowles that a subject yelled there was a man with a gun. Bowles advised Dennis to enter the Triad building and lock the door.

Bowles heard approximately thirty to forty gunshots fired. Bowles stated he never observed the gunman. Bowles indicated while he was looking out the window he observed an unknown male pulling another unknown subject by the hood of his sweatshirt across the ABB parking lot.

Allen Grothe

Grothe advised he was sitting in his office, which is located in the front of the Triad Manufacturing Company. Grothe stated he began hearing gunfire; he then looked out the window of his office and observed an unknown male, who appeared to be wearing a light colored jacket, walking southbound on Semple firing a rifle.

The subject also had another rifle draped over his back. Grothe watched the subject walk southbound out of site, but heard approximately thirty plus gunshots. Grothe could not give a further description of the subject due to the lighting.

Detective Terron Murphy interviewed Triad employee Robert Lawrence.

Robert Lawrence

Lawrence stated he arrived at work today at approximately 6:20 a.m. and began his daily duties. Approximately fifteen minutes into his shift he observed six people run in through the side door near the dock where he was working. All the subjects were screaming that someone is shooting outside.

Not sure of what was going on, Lawrence peeked out of the door the subjects entered and heard thirty to forty gunshots from an unknown type of gun. Lawrence stated he didn't see who was shooting because he ran and hid to avoid being hurt.

Detective Ronald Martin interviewed Triad employee Kevin Patrick Brown.

Kevin Patrick Brown

Brown stated he was opening dock doors on the Triad Manufacturing Building at 4321 Semple. As Brown opened the dock doors, he heard gunshots and then observed numerous people running from the ABB building. The people that were running from the ABB building entered the dock doors.

Brown stated he did not see the individual who was shooting a firearm. The ABB employees were allowed in the Triad Building and Brown along with other Triad personnel locked all the doors in the building and notified the Police.

Randall Scott Creech

Witness Creech stated he was standing near the dock area on the east side of the building when he heard numerous gunshots coming from outside his place of employment. Creech stated he went outside to investigate when he observed approximately four to five employees of ABB attempting to conceal themselves from gunfire underneath a trailer. Creech stated they advised the ABB employees to enter the Triad building for safety. Creech stated at no time did he see the shooter.

Police Officer Michael Clymer interviewed Triad employee Stephen A. Watson.

Stephen A. Watson

Witness Watson stated he was standing on the north receiving docks unloading containers when two women from ABB approached the side doors and stated someone at ABB was in the parking lot shooting. Watson indicated the women entered through the north side doors of the dock. After the women made entry into the loading docks, Watson went to the doors they entered to investigate.

While standing near the doors Watson heard six gunshots. He shut the doors and proceeded to the south double entrance side doors to look outside. Watson stood at the doors that were still open, and he heard gunshots being fired. He stated he could see people running frantically towards the railroad tracks.

As he was looking outside, he observed four men hiding behind some containers on the lot. He let all four of the men inside their facility. He stated ten seconds later, another man came inside their building. After the last male entered, they locked the door. He stated approximately one minute after locking the doors, the gunshots stopped.

Everyone then grouped together inside by the loading dock doors, then walked west to the wood shop area to make sure they were safe. They stayed in the wood shop area of their building for about an hour after the shooting stopped. He never saw the shooter, he just saw people running and heard the shots.

Detective Kevin J. Bentley interviewed Triad employees Paul Green and Doug Mottert.

Paul Green

Green stated he was standing in the wood shop supervisor's office which is located on the east side of the Triad building, when he heard a noise that he thought was someone chopping ice. He looked out of the east window and observed a subject wearing a baseball hat with a rifle strapped to his back, and holding an assault rifle firing gunshots towards the train tracks (south). Green further stated that he began evacuating employees and directing them towards the northwest corner of the building. Green was unable to give any other

description of the suspect.

Doug Mottert

Mottert stated he was standing in the wood shop supervisor's office which is located on the east side of the Triad building. Mottert stated he heard several gunshots in quick succession and responded to the windows that face east. Mottert observed a white male wearing a baseball style hat with a rifle slung over his back and shooting an assault rifle. Mottert stated he then advised his employees to start heading towards the back of the building and to lock all the doors.

Detective Elfonzo Hayes interviewed United Rentals employee Matthew Roettger.

Matthew Roettger

Matthew Roettger of United Rentals at 5500 Bircher advised that he heard twenty gunshots coming from the area of the ABB Company but did not see anyone.

Detective Sean Mallon interviewed ABB employees Tiffany Chatman and Gregory Martin.

Tiffany Chatman

Chatman stated she was in Terry Mabry's office which is located on the south side of the main aisle below the Winding Office. Chatman was retrieving an item from the office, when she observed Terry on his cell phone running toward the office yelling for someone to call 911. Chatman said that she exited the office and was standing in the middle of the aisle when she observed numerous employees running toward her and yelling at her to get out of the middle of the aisle because someone had a gun.

Chatman ran in the same direction as the other employees and heard a single gunshot. Chatman and the other employees then ran up a set of stairs and into the Winding Department. She then heard approximately three more gunshots. She and the other employees ran out of the west Winding exterior doors and across the street to Triad. She did not see who was shooting and did not see anyone get shot. Chatman also stated she didn't know who she was with when she was running due to the fact everything happened very quickly.

Gregory Martin

Martin stated he was at Machine Number Seven, located in the Winding Department, at shift change when he saw people running towards him yelling "Get out of the building people are shooting." Martin grabbed his personal belongings and ran out the exterior west Winding door and across the street to Triad. Martin stated he was the first person out of the door and the first one into Triad, where he remained until the Police arrived. Martin stated he heard

approximately twelve gunshots in total, six while he was inside the building and six as he ran across the street; however he did not see who was shooting.

Detective Jerry Griffin interviewed ABB employees Ellen J. Prather and David A. Crain.

Ellen J. Prather

Prather stated she arrived to work at 5:40 a.m., walked into the building and down the stairs to the female locker room, where she changed into her work shoes and safety glasses. After having the company's morning meeting she was walking through the Winding Department when she heard a female's voice, that she recognized as "Regina" yelling "Everybody get out of the building, everybody get out of the building, somebody is shooting."

Prather stated she looked for the closest exit. Seeing a door just to her left, she ran out the west side door through the very first gate and across the street, where she hid underneath some trailers. She hid there about one minute then noticed employees running into the east side door of "Triad" company. Prather stated she followed them into the "Triad" building.

Prather stated as she was running from the Winding building, she heard ten to fifteen gunshots coming from the building as if the suspect had entered the Winding Department as she was leaving. Prather stated she did not see the suspect or anyone sustain an injury during the shooting.

David A. Crain.

Crain stated he arrived at work between 4:00 a.m. and 4:30 a.m. Crain began working at his desk until sometime around 6:30 a.m. He received a call from his friend, employee Terry Mabry who yelled into the phone "Call 911 there is shooting going on in the Annex." Crain stated he first thought Mabry was joking and replied "Come on Terry" when Terry yelled again "Call 911, get out" and he knew something was wrong.

Crain stated he dialed 911 from his desk and it rang numerous times until a message came on telling him all lines were busy. He hung up and grabbed his cell phone and left the office walking out the building where he saw his friend (employee Terry Mabry) lying on the ground bleeding and being helped by employee Matt Elder. He stated Matt Elder and another employee were helping carry victim Mabry.

Crain walked across the street into the Triad building where he stayed until police arrived. Crain stated while waiting inside the Triad building he received a call from employee Vickie Wilson who told him that she was hiding inside the Winding building and didn't know what to do. He instructed Wilson to stay hidden and he would call her back.

Detective Brian Seppi interviewed ABB employee David Tibbetts.

David Tibbetts

Tibbetts, who is employed as a Coil Winder for ABB made the following statement: He arrived at work at 6:30 a.m. at the Winding Department. At approximately 6:35 a.m. he observed people running up the stairs from the floor below yelling, "Get out."

He heard several gunshots coming from downstairs. Tibbetts heard approximately twenty to thirty gunshots and it sounded like they were coming from some sort of automatic assault rifle. He grabbed some of his personal belongings and ran out of the building with the rest of the employees.

Tibbetts exited ABB from the west side of the building and ran south on Semple toward the parking lot where his truck was parked. Tibbetts entered his vehicle and was driving off the parking lot and noticed people waving at him from the Triad parking lot motioning him to pull on the lot at their location. Tibbetts stated he pulled onto the Triad lot and exited his vehicle and hid underneath a truck trailer by the loading docks of Triad.

Tibbetts was with Jeff Kitowski and Osie Dixon. While he was hiding underneath the truck he heard the sound of gunfire coming from down the street and he believed it was coming toward his direction. Tibbetts observed a white male wearing a light colored jacket and a dark colored baseball hat walking south on Semple with an assault rifle raised to a ready position and firing gunshots.

He thought he observed some type of bag or ammunition holder around the subject's waist. The subject continued firing as he walked south. Tibbetts stated he (suspect) was firing in the direction of the guard shack in the rear of the ABB building. Tibbetts was approximately seventy to one hundred yards from the subject as he was shooting.

Someone from Triad then opened the rear door and told him and the other people he was with to get inside. They ran inside of Triad and he was unable to see what occurred across the street at the ABB Company. Tibbetts stated he believed it was approximately five to seven minutes from the time he first heard gunshots to the time he entered Triad.

Detective Charles Wall interviewed ABB employees Stephen Randall Sharp III and Scott D. Tolie.

Stephen Randall Sharp III

Sharp works in the Winding Department which he stated is located above the Assembly Area. He worked overnight from 10:30 p.m. to 6:30 a.m. At approximately 6:30 a.m. or 6:40 a.m. he was in the Winding Department waiting for the buzzer to sound which indicates relief for the shift currently on duty.

He observed a black male and black female, both employees of ABB, running towards him. He believes the male's name is Mario and the female's name is Regina. These individuals ran toward the door and told him to get out of the building because there was a man armed with a gun. Sharp heard multiple gunshots coming from the Assembly Area of the building and immediately exited the building through the west door of the Winding Department.

He responded to the parking lot located to the south of the Winding building. Sharp entered his vehicle which was parked on the parking lot. Sharp heard gunshots coming from outside of the building. Sharp decided to exit his vehicle and find a place to hide. He ran southeast across the parking lot toward several large white drums located on the southeast corner of the parking lot.

Sharp observed the shooter wearing a tan top, possibly a one piece jump suit, and black knit cap walking south on the parking lot. He stated the subject was armed with a long rifle and was shooting at anything and everything. He believed the shooter reloaded as the shooting stopped briefly, then began again.

Sharp went down a flight of stairs near the large drums and went to hide behind a large transformer which was next to the train track southeast of the parking lot. He last observed the shooter walking north on the parking lot back toward the building. Sharp believed the incident lasted approximately five to ten minutes.

Scott D. Tolie

Tolie indicated that he worked in the Test Department where he performed tests on large transformers. The Test Department encompasses three floors on the west wall of the main assembly area.

Tolie stated he was scheduled to work from 6:00 a.m., to 2:30 p.m. He car pooled to work with Jeff Ray and they arrived to work at approximately 6:20 a.m. Tolie got dressed for work in a locker room located near the control center of the Test Department which is located on the second floor.

After getting dressed, Tolie went down three flights of stairs to the assembly floor, where he was confronted by Terry Mabry, who is the assembly supervisor. Mabry instructed Tolie to go back upstairs. Tolie stated Mabry appeared to be very serious so he went to the control center without asking any questions. Once he reached the control center he heard what he initially believed were capacitors blowing up on the assembly floor.

Tolie observed Keith Garner in the control room. Tolie asked Garner if he shut down the power. Garner told Tolie that he had already shut down the power. Tolie asked Garner if he was okay and Garner told Tolie that he was not okay, that he was bleeding. Garner fell to the floor of the control center. Tolie realized that the sound he was hearing coming from the assembly floor was in

fact gunfire as windows were shattering in the control center and he could hear the sound of bullets whizzing by.

Tolie left the control room area and responded up to the third floor storage area. While in that location, he continued to hear gunfire. He believed the gunfire continued out onto the parking lot; however, he was lying on the floor of the storage area and did not look outside. Tolie remained in the storage area where he was eventually rescued by Police personnel. Tolie stated he never saw the shooter. He estimated the shooting lasted approximately three to five minutes. Tolie estimated he heard more than fifty gunshots.

Detective Jimmy Hyatt interviewed ABB employees Jeff Ray, Triad Employee Chuck Shane and Jack Spencer.

Jeff Ray

Ray stated he has been an ABB employee for approximately fourteen years and was in the east Annex Building when he observed the shooter walking north along the aisle near the break room, which is directly across from the door Ray was near. He stated the suspect turned west, faced him, and then fired several times, either at him or in his general direction where he was located.

Ray stated he turned and ran toward the main assembly aisle where he encountered the assembly section having their morning meeting. Ray then warned everyone to get out. Ray stated the supervisor, Terry Mabry, told him to call 911 as he (Mabry) proceeded through the door that Ray had just came from.

Ray stated he ran to the Winding section and warned the employees there and exited the plant out the west door of the Winding Department and ran across the street to the shipping and receiving door of "Triad."

When asked if he could describe the suspect, Ray stated all he could tell was the shooter had on a tan "Carhart" type jacket.

Ray stated he initially heard four or five shots and then continued hearing shots in the main building as he was evacuating the plant.

Ray concluded the interview by saying, "we should have seen it coming" because Tim H. has been behaving strangely for the past year or so, adding that "Tim H. used to be a happy go lucky" guy, and would tell jokes everyday. He added that in the past year he has just "clammed up." He advised that Tim H. has kept a notebook of job assignments and who would give the job to him and to other employees.

This concluded the interview with Jeff Ray.

Shane stated he along with several other Triad employees were in the northeast office when he heard three to five shots coming from east of his location. He advised he looked out the office windows which faced east and observed a person with a heavy jacket with a firearm.

He advised the shooter fired at a white car traveling north on Semple and then pointed the firearm to the south toward the railroad tracks and fired again.

Shane advised the Detective that it was too dark and too far to see if the person firing the gun was black or white. He further advised there are no security cameras in operation on the Triad premises.

Jack Spencer

Spencer advised he heard three to five shots and looked through the northeast office window of the Triad building and observed a "figure" with a firearm. Spencer stated at this point he got down onto the floor.

This concluded the interview with Jack Spencer.

Detective Charles Betts interviewed ABB employee Matthew J. Elder.

Matthew J. Elder

Victim Elder stated at approximately 6:40 A.M., he had just finished a morning meeting in the "Winding Department" and was walking east into the "Sizing Department," located in the "Main Assembly" building.

Upon entering the building, Elder was approached by a frantic female ABB employee who informed him that there was someone shooting in the "Annex" building. Shortly thereafter, Elder, along with other ABB employees who had gathered in the "Main Assembly" building, heard numerous gunshots being fired.

Noting the gunshots were getting louder, Elder instructed the ABB employees to exit the building. The employees began fleeing the building via the various exit doors.

After ensuring all the ABB employees had exited the "Main Assembly" building, Elder headed toward the "Human Resources Department." While running, he noted the gunshots were becoming increasingly louder. Upon arrival in the "Human Resources Department" he found the office areas clear of employees.

From the "Human Resources Department," Elder exited the building and observed Victim Mabry lying on the ground. Victim Mabry informed Elder he had been shot; however, Elder was unable to determine the location of Victim Mabry's injuries.

While attempting to assist Victim Mabry out of the area, Elder observed Victim Sharp II, and the two assisted in moving Victim Mabry between some vehicles

which were parked on the employee parking lot located just south of the "Winding" building. Elder indicated they were in close proximity to the security guard office.

Elder, Victim Mabry, and Victim Sharp, II became "pinned down" between the vehicles as the "shooter" approached their location by traveling south from the west side of the "Winding" building. The "shooter" ran from the southwest corner of the "Winding" building at which time Victim Sharp II, who was now observed in possession of a small handgun, fired approximately four times at the "shooter."

Following the series of shots by Victim Sharp II, he informed Elder that he was out of ammunition. Victim Sharp II then ran south through the parking lot. Upon doing so, Elder heard the "shooter," whose voice he recognized as Timothy H.'s, state something similar to "I'm going to get you, you shot at me, I'm going to get you!" Elder heard several additional gunshots and then observed Timothy H. turn and walk toward Victim Mabry.

Timothy H. approached Victim Mabry and stated something similar to, "I got you now, you're going to get what you deserve!" Timothy H. then shot the assault rifle several times into the ground. Timothy H. turned and fired the assault rifle at the security guard office, and then walked north toward the "Winding" building, out of Elder's sight.

Elder waited a short period of time and then ran west to the loading docks of the Triad Manufacturing building, located at 4321 Semple Avenue. Employees of Triad granted Elder access to the building, where he and other ABB employees remained until arrival of the police department.

Detective Betts transferred the digital media, containing the interviews that he conducted, to a Compact Disc and seized it as evidence. Detective Betts assigned the digital media Homicide Section's Audio/Video File Number 5962CD.

Detective Lloyd White interviewed ABB employee Osie Dixson Jr.

Osie Dixson Jr.

Osie Dixson stated he is an employee of ABB, Inc. and he arrived at work at approximately 5:45 a.m. Dixson stated at 6:30 a.m. he went to the Human Resource building for a morning meeting with other co-workers. After a short meeting and receiving their daily assignments, he walked out of the building and a white male co-worker that he only knows as "Jeff" ran past him yelling, that there was a shooter in the Annex Building. Dixson stated he ignored "Jeff" believing that "Jeff" was joking because he did not hear or see anyone shooting. Dixson stated he continued walking outside, south toward the Material and Annex Buildings where he observed a white male, wearing a tan colored shirt and a backpack around his waist, carrying a long brown rifle down to his side. Dixson stated the white male appeared to have another long dark gun with a black

strap across his right shoulder.

Dixson stated when the white male made eye contact with him (Dixson) the male raised the rifle to his eye level and fired three shots at him. Dixson stated he ran back inside the Human Resource building. Dixson stated he continued to run through the Assembly Area, then the Winding Area, at which time he heard four to five shots come from the Assembly Area. Dixson stated he ran out the door of the Winding Area on to the Semple Ave side of the Winding Building. Dixson stated he ran across Semple Ave to the Triad Company for safety and hid behind parked vehicles on Triad's parking lot as he watched the white male shooter also come out the Winding Building.

Dixson stated the white male shooter then walked south toward the rear ABB southwest parking lot and began rapidly shooting at vehicles that drove off the parking lot. Dixson stated he could see people on the parking lot running toward the south end of the parking lot.

Dixson stated he heard more gunshots coming from the parking lot, but the gunshots sounded like a small caliber gun, as if someone else began firing gunshots on the parking lot. Dixson stated the white male began firing intense rapid shots as if he was focused on whoever was shooting at him. Dixson stated he could not see who was firing the smaller firearm.

Dixson stated after all the gunshots ceased, he and several employees were allowed to enter the Triad Company for safety.

Detectives Mercier and Fox interviewed ABB employees Justin Bahre, Jeffery Kitowski and John Greenwalt.

Justin Bahre

Bahre was in the Main Assembly Aisle being briefed by the prior shift when Jeff Ray ran into the building yelling, "He's got a gun!" Bahre paused for a moment, but when he heard gunfire he started running towards the cafeteria area. Bahre stated that he turned around and saw a subject walk through the east entrance door, into the Main Assembly Aisle carrying a rifle.

Bahre advised Detective Fox and Detective Mercier that he only saw that the subject had a dark colored hat and was a white male.

Bahre and several other employees ran upstairs through the Winding Department and then out a side door which exited onto Semple. The group ran south on Semple and he and a few other employees stood near his truck on the main parking lot. Bahre stated that he then observed the subject come out of the side door and begin randomly shooting at the guard shack and into the parking lot. Bahre advised that he did not observe anyone get shot.

Bahre ran across Semple and hid under a tractor trailer which was parked on the

Triad parking lot. After about two or three minutes, an employee from Triad opened their doors and allowed several of the ABB employees into their building.

The interview was concluded at that time.

Jeffery Kitowski

Kitowski stated that he was located in the Winding Department being briefed by Steve Sharp II, who was the 3rd watch operator of the machine Kitowski would work that day.

Kitowski estimated at about 6:37 a.m., he observed a large group of people running through the Winding Department to a side exit door. Kitowski advised Detectives that many in the group were yelling, but he could not understand what they were saying. Based on how the other employees were acting, he decided to run out of the exit door as well.

Kitowski stated that once they got outside, he heard someone yell, "He's shooting." Kitowski and several other employees ran south on Semple towards the main parking lot.

Kitowski and the other employees crossed Semple and hid under a tractor trailer on Triad's parking lot.

A short time later, Kitowski observed a subject exit a side door holding a rifle. The subject got into a shooting stance and began randomly shooting towards the main parking lot. The subject then continued walking south on Semple firing the weapon. Kitowski advised that the subject made it about halfway across the parking lot when the subject turned and went back into the building. Kitowski advised that he was about 100 yards away from the subject with the rifle and could only see his silhouette.

Kitowski stated that he was under the tractor trailer for about three or four minutes when an employee from Triad opened their doors and allowed several ABB employees to come inside their business.

The interview was concluded at that time.

John Greenwalt

Witness John Greenwalt stated he is an employee at ABB and he arrived to work a little late, approximately 6:35 a.m. due to the snowy weather. Greenwalt heard noises coming from the Winding Building. When Greenwalt walked into the Winding Building he clearly heard multiple gunshots. He immediately turned and went back out the door, walked back to the employee parking lot, and continued to hear gunshots. He saw employees coming out the door on the west side of the Winding Building. Greenwalt could hear people saying there is somebody shooting. Moments later, Greenwalt saw a subject with a rifle pointing it at

employees and shooting. Greenwalt indicated he observed the subject walk south from the west side of the Winding Building, to the parking lot and began firing shots at the employees. Everyone outside was running and the subject with the gun began shooting at everyone. Greenwalt went back into the Winding Building.

Greenwalt got into his vehicle and contacted 911 from his cellular telephone and gave them his (Greenwalt) location.

The person he saw with the rifle shooting was a white male, who appeared to be in his 40's or 50's, approximately 5'7ft to 5'8ft, 145lbs - 160lbs, wearing brown coveralls. He could not see the subject's face because the rifle was being held in front of his face while he was shooting. Greenwalt heard that Timothy H. was responsible for the shooting from other co-workers, but could not say that Timothy H. was the shooter because of his face being hidden by the rifle.

Greenwalt observed Terry Mabry fall forward and then roll over on the ground during the shooting, but he did not see the shooter actually shoot Mabry. He wanted to go help Mabry, but Matt Elder was telling him to get back. Elder went to talk to Mabry while he was on the ground and Mabry was able to get up on his own and all three of them began walking, trying to locate the position of the shooter, but yet stay out the sight of the shooter.

They all got separated between the cars in an attempt to take cover from the shooter. While using a truck on the parking lot as a barrier between him and the shooter, he could see the shooter continue to shoot at everyone on the parking lot.

Greenwalt observed what he believed to be another individual shot lying on the ground at the south end of the parking lot, near the gate. Greenwalt could not check on that person because he was afraid of being shot.

Greenwalt advised the Detectives that Timothy H. was an open and joking person, until the point that he and Timothy H. were back on the "floor" (job that requires manual labor) after being supervisors. That is when the change started to occur and Timothy H. often spoke about being disappointed and hurt that he was back on the "floor." Timothy H. was not joking or very conversational and Greenwalt also believed that Timothy H. was also having marital issues.

Greenwalt's interview was recorded on digital recorder and later placed on a CD. The CD was placed in the Homicide Audio File under file number 5971. An additional copy of the CD was packaged and placed in the Property Room as evidence.

During the crime scene investigation, Detective Jackson was advised that a witness requested to enter the crime scene to retrieve her vehicle. Detectives Jackson and White met with Janisha Johnson who identified herself and indicated that she is the shift security supervisor.

Janisha Johnson

Detective Jackson requested that Johnson provide identification to that effect. Johnson displayed her security identification card. Johnson stated that she is employed by Securitas Security Company as a supervisor at the ABB site. Johnson's security license number is 27283 issued on October 9, 2009, with an expiration date of January 1, 2011.

Johnson stated she arrived at work at 5:55 a.m., and entered the Guard Post which is located on the south side of the lot. Later, Johnson was on a roving foot patrol in the parking lot area. She returned to the security booth, which was being manned by Security Officer Cordin Hudson. She looked at her surveillance video screen at 6:38 a.m., and observed numerous people running from the Winding Building. Johnson opened the Guard Post door and heard approximately twenty gunshots. While speaking with Hudson, they observed several employees running from the building via the west Winding room exit on the surveillance monitor located in the guard booth.

She immediately exited her Guard Post and ran south through the parking lot with an ABB employee, she believed to be Edwin Lange. She and Lange entered his vehicle to leave the property; however, Lange could not locate his vehicle key. Johnson and Lange ran to her vehicle which was also parked on the south parking lot and drove south to the south entrance. Johnson stated she was afraid to drive her vehicle north on Semple past the location where the gunshots originated, to leave the area. While stopped near the south entrance to the south parking lot, her vehicle lost traction and got stuck in the snow.

Johnson and Lange exited the vehicle and decided to leave the area on foot. Eight other individuals followed the two off the property. All of the individuals ran west along the train tracks to avoid the subject who was shooting at employees. Johnson stated she removed her white Security supervisor shirt as she ran along the railroad tracks, to avoid being targeted by the gunman. Johnson stated the group she left the area with responded to the MFR Tire Service station. All of the individuals waited for the Police to arrive.

On Sunday January 10, 2010, Detective Jackson was advised by Detective Hyatt that additional ballistic evidence was located and recovered by construction workers during demolition of damaged property within the ABB complex.

At approximately 4:30 p.m., Detective Jackson responded to 4350 Semple and met with Detective Hyatt. Detective Hyatt advised that a construction worker and maintenance worker indicated they discovered some cartridge casings in several different locations while they demolished and cleaned the office area in the complex.

Detective Hyatt responded and took possession of a gold projectile from a construction worker. The construction worker, identified as Randy Green, of

R.A. Green Construction Company, showed the Detective where the projectile was located.

The projectile was located along the west wall of the "Winding Building" near the south end of the building. It appeared the projectile had traveled from the south end of the building through the wall and ultimately ricocheted off the west wall.

At approximately 3:30 p.m., Detective Hyatt, seized (18) 7.62 x 39 cartridge casings and (1) partial projectile along with several fragments of projectiles from Tony Brown, a Maintenance Technician from ABB.

Mr. Brown stated he received the fragments from other employees who were working in the Winding room. Brown also stated he located the (18) cartridge casings and (1) projectile on the west fence line at 4350 Semple.

The items were seized and later transported to the Department Laboratory by Detective Hyatt.

After collecting the ballistic evidence, Detectives Hyatt and Jackson conducted a walk-through and discovered additional cartridge casings and bullets. The Detectives observed ballistic damage to the south and west interior walls of the Winding Room. The Evidence Technician Unit was notified of the ballistic damage and evidence.

Officer Jennifer Dudley, DSN 5551, who is assigned to the Evidence Technician Unit, responded to the scene, taking the necessary photographs, which are incorporated in her supplemental report.

On January 12, 2010, Detectives Jackson and White responded to 307 Dobbins and met with Kathleen Hendron, Timothy H.'s wife. The Detectives interviewed Kathleen. The following is a synopsis of that interview.

Kathleen Hendron

Kathleen stated she had no information about what happen at ABB. She has only been advised that people were killed and terrorized at the company. Her family has been shielding her from the incident during the past week. The Detectives were told that Timothy H. was ostracized at ABB for attempting to start a union and also for participating in a lawsuit against ABB, sighting violations relative to the (ERISA) Employee Retirement Income Security Act.

Timothy H. was scheduled to travel to Kansas City to testify in a hearing regarding the (ERISA) violation concerning the pension fund on January 11, 2010. Timothy H. was afraid that he would not do well on the stand and discredit himself as an incompetent employee. Kathleen stated Timothy H. has been mistreated at work for a long time and his vehicle and home have been vandalized on several occasions because of his involvement in the lawsuit.

Detective Jackson asked Kathleen if her husband owned any guns and if so, were they missing. Kathleen stated, "Yes," her husband has a few guns for hunting and target practice; however, she doesn't allow him to keep any guns at their residence. Timothy H. and Kathleen own a lake house in Hermann Missouri and Timothy H. stored his weapons there.

Kathleen told the Detectives that Timothy H. used to be a second shift supervisor at ABB. The company eliminated the second shift and he was assigned to an administrative position. His supervisor made it difficult for him, so Timothy H. decided to go back to the assembly area, where he used to supervise. When ABB management decided to bring back the second shift he was not able to resume his previous duty as a supervisor.

Detective Jackson asked if Timothy H. left a note or letter giving forewarning or explaining what he planned to do at ABB on January 7, 2010. She indicated that he left a "Post it" note that read "I love you both." She indicated that he would normally leave her "Post it" notes when he left for work. When asked by Detective Jackson, Kathleen indicated that Timothy H. travelled to the lake house located in Hermann, Missouri on Wednesday night. Kathleen H. agreed to allow the Detectives to continue their investigation at her lake house by searching for any weapons that may have been left there by Timothy H.

This concludes the interview with Kathleen Hendron.

On January 13, 2010, at 10:00 a.m., Special Agent Brian Hoffman, of the Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms, contacted Detective Jackson via telephone. Special Agent Hoffman advised that he conducted a gun trace investigation on the weapons recovered at ABB. Gun trace number T20100011459 was processed on the recovered Hi Pointe .45 caliber handgun serial number X488320. Special Agent Hoffman stated the recovered handgun had information on file indicating the last known owner of the weapon was Timothy H. The weapon was purchased by this individual on January 23, 2008, at Mid America Arms located at 8205 Gravois St. Louis Missouri.

Gun trace number T20100011472 on the recovered Hi Pointe .40 caliber handgun, serial number X769837, revealed the recovered handgun had information on file indicating the last known owner of the weapon was Timothy H. The weapon was purchased by this individual on April 4, 2008, at Mid America Arms located at 8205 Gravois St. Louis Missouri.

Gun trace number T20100011480 on the recovered Tri Star 12 gauge pump action shotgun, serial number M9A01688, revealed the recovered shotgun had information on file indicating the last known owner of the weapon was Timothy H. The weapon was purchased by this individual on January 6, 2010, at Cabela's Retail located at 5555 St. Louis Mills Boulevard Hazelwood Missouri.

rifle serial number 1971CR3188, revealed the recovered rifle had information on file indicating the last known owner of the weapon was Timothy H. The weapon was purchased by this individual on January 6, 2010, at Dennis Hardware Inc. located at One Gravois Road in Fenton, Missouri.

This concludes the Special Agent's investigation.

Based on the gun trace information received on January 11, 2010, Detective Jackson responded to Dennis Hardware located at 1 Gravois, Fenton Missouri, and met with a store associate. Detective Jackson advised that he was conducting an investigation of a criminal incident involving a Romanian (AK-47) purchased from Dennis Hardware on January 6, 2010. Detective Jackson asked if the business had an operational video surveillance system.

Detective Jackson was advised that the business had no operating surveillance camera on January 6, 2010. The store manager conducted an inquiry of the firearm serial number. The store manager gave Detective Jackson a copy of the sales invoice per # AAM016090-AM00 containing prices of the firearm, magazines and ammunition purchased by Timothy H.

Detectives White and Jackson responded to 1400 Hartshorn Road, Hermann Missouri, on January 22, 2010. The Detectives met with Timothy H.'s wife Kathleen and were allowed to enter her lake house and surrounding property to search for any notes, evidence, or weapons left there by Timothy H. There was nothing of evidentiary value located.

On January 25, 2010, Detective Jackson conveyed the Closed Circuit television footage from the Cyber Crimes Unit to the Police Academy and transferred custody to Technician Pikoraitis. Pikoraitis converted the images to a DVD and placed them in chronological order tracking subject Timothy H.'s actions and location on multiple cameras throughout the ABB facility.

Detective Jackson responded to the Homicide office where he viewed the video recording. Detective Jackson observed a vehicle traveling south on Semple, from Bircher, video time stamp of 6:25 a.m. The vehicle stopped at the access gate leading to the Shipping and Receiving area. After waiting a few moments the gate opened, allowing the vehicle entry.

The vehicle stopped near the Annex building, video time stamp 6:27 a.m., Timothy H. exited the vehicle, obtained two long guns from the rear seat area of the vehicle, and approached the Annex building. Interior surveillance cameras captured images of Timothy H. walking through the maintenance area with employees running away from the area. Later, on an exterior surveillance camera, Timothy H. was seen shooting at victim Carter and Green with a rifle as they attempted to escape the area in their vehicles, time stamp 6:27 a.m.

The surveillance video in its entirety was seized from the surveillance system computer hard drive by Detective Steve Taubenheim, DSN 6584, a copy will be

stored in Property Custody.

On January 22, 2010, Detective Jackson met with William Frasco who is the Head of Special Investigations for ABB. Frasco was advised of the facts and circumstances surrounding the investigation by Detective Jackson. Frasco advised Detective Jackson that he has not assembled any background information regarding Timothy H.'s relationship with his co-workers and managers. He also advised Detective Jackson that he was conducting an internal investigation, which included interviewing ABB employees. Detective Jackson prepared a Property Receipt and returned the video surveillance system to Frasco.

On February 15, 2010, at approximately 2:39 p.m., Detective Jimmy Hyatt was requested to respond to The North Patrol Division Detective Bureau relative to a person wanting to be listed as a victim instead of a witness during the ABB incident. Detective Hyatt re-interviewed witness Lorin C. Smith Jr.

Lorin C. Smith Jr.

Smith advised the Detective that he has been an employee at ABB for approximately four and one half years and is currently a Tester for the company.

Smith advised he had arrived to work at approximately 5:50 a.m., and was in the main assembly room in the (north area), which is also part of the Winding Building.

Smith stated as Don Puder was taking some equipment down the hallway, he observed Mark Campbell and Justin Bahre also near the hallway. He observed Jeff Ray running and as Ray approached Campbell and Berra, he was telling them something and he seemed to be frantic. He approached Justin Berra and asked him what Jeff Ray told him. Berra advised him that Ray had told him that there is a gunman shooting inside the building, at which time Smith advised he began to leave the building.

When he got close to the steps leading to the Winding Room, he attempted to call Don Puder on his cell phone and warn him there was a shooter in the building. Puder didn't believe him and hung up on him. Smith advised that as soon as he got to the stairway to Winding, he started hearing "popping noises." As Smith and others ran up the stairs, he exited the west door where the "winders" take their smoke breaks and then proceeded south along Semple, to the employee parking lot.

At the south end of the complex, he observed one of the customers attempting to enter the property when he advised him not to come in due to a shooting. After telling the customer not to come in, he looked north and observed muzzle flashes but could not see the suspect.

He heard numerous gunshots and observed a dark colored SUV drive north and swerve towards the fence and the door he had previously exited.

After reaching the railroad tracks, he heard more shooting and thinks he heard "whizzing" noises and assumed they were gunshots but doesn't know what that sounds like.

Smith advised he and several other employees found safety in the Tire Factory where they were met by two Police Officers.

This concludes the interview with Smith.

On February 18, 2010 at Police Headquarters, at approximately 3:45 p.m., Detective Jackson met with victim Stephen Sharp II who recovered from his injuries he sustained from the shooting. Sharp II was placed in interview room number one where he was interviewed by Detective Jackson.

Stephen Sharp II

Sharp II stated he was standing at his tool box preparing for work at shift change when a group of people ran upstairs past his location screaming, "Someone is shooting." He observed those subjects running toward the exits. Moments later he heard several gunshots. Sharp II left his work area and ran to the office area where he observed Terry Mabry and John Green running upstairs. Sharp II observed that Terry Mabry was bleeding and could barely walk.

Sharp II assisted Mabry outside the building and asked some of the fleeing employees to help him with Mabry who had collapsed on the parking lot. Matt, a Winding supervisor, came to help him. Sharp II heard the gunshots on the west side of the building and the sound of the shooting sounded as if it were getting closer toward his location on the parking lot.

Sharp II advised Matt that he (Sharp II) had to go to his truck to retrieve his handgun. Sharp II went to his truck and obtained his handgun and took cover behind a vehicle on the lot. From that location he could see the person who was now standing near the building firing a rifle. When the armed subject began to cross the parking lot Sharp II fired at him. Sharp II indicated that he fired at the armed subject until he ran out of ammunition.

Sharp II ducked and ran behind the parked vehicle to take cover. Sharp saw his son Stephen Sharp III on the parking lot and advised him to run because he was out of ammunition. Sharp II attempted to run toward the guard shack at the south end of the parking lot but was hit by gunfire and went down. He stayed down and didn't move fearing that he would be shot again by the gunman.

Sharp II remained on the ground until the Police arrived and conveyed him to Union and Bircher where he was placed in an ambulance and conveyed to the hospital. When asked by Detective Jackson if he knew who the shooter was. Sharp II indicated that he did not recognize who the shooter was at the time of the shooting.

Sharp II provided a description of the handgun that he fired. It was a Walther PPKS .380 semi automatic stainless with a black handle. The handgun was loaded with seven bullets in the magazine and one in the chamber. He fired all eight bullets at the gunman in a western direction toward the Winding room.

Sharp's statement was recorded on a digital recording device and later transferred to a disk and placed in the Homicide audio recording file under number 6087.

On March 15, 2010, Detective Jackson contacted an associate at Cabela's sporting goods store and requested video surveillance of the checkout register area on January 6, 2010. Detective Jackson was referred to the store's Asset Protection Manager James MacKeen. MacKeen indicated he could comply with the Detective's request, after the appropriate written request was received from the Police Department. Later during the week of March 15th Detective Jackson spoke with MacKeen via telephone. During that conversation MacKeen stated that he had retrieved the requested video and it was ready for pickup at the Cabela's store.

On March 26, 2010, Detectives Jackson and Sabin responded to Cabela's located at 5555 St. Louis Mills Blvd Hazelwood Missouri and met with the Asset Protection manager James MacKeen. MacKeen provided Detective Jackson with the video surveillance images depicting on January 6, 2010, at approximately 9:53 p.m., Timothy H. purchasing a shotgun, sling and twelve gauge ammunition. MacKeen also provided a copy of the sales receipt reflecting the sale of the mentioned items. Detective Jackson seized the disc containing the above mentioned video and receipt information.

On August 12, 2010, at approximately 3:00 p.m., Detective Jackson contacted Security Officer Cordin Hudson via telephone. Detective Jackson inquired if the gate controls to the annex building access road were located in the guard shack. Hudson stated, "Yes." When asked if he allowed any vehicles access through the gate he indicated that he did not; however, he did see a gray Malibu pass him near the annex building while he was on patrol. Hudson stated he does not know for sure how the gray vehicle got through the gate but it is possible that Security Officer Janisha Johnson, who was in the guard shack, allowed the vehicle through.

With this, Detective Jackson contacted Securitas Security Services to conduct a follow-up interview with Security Officer Janisha Johnson regarding who let Timothy H. in through the security gate. Through the Human Resources office, Detective Jackson was able to arrange an interview with Security Officer Janisha Johnson at the Homicide office on August 20, 2010.

On August 20, 2010, at approximately 9:45 a.m., Security Officer Janisha Johnson and Sherri Parker, who is the Area Human Resources Manager for Securitas Security Services, met with Detective Jackson at Police Headquarters.

Janisha Johnson

Johnson stated that the gate access control was in the guard shack located on the west wall of the ABB facility. Minutes prior to the shooting she was inside the guard shack alone as Security Officer Hudson was on foot patrol around the facility. A vehicle which she could see on the surveillance monitor in the guard shack approached the access gate leading to the Annex building area.

She pressed the gate control button, after a brief conversation with the driver of that vehicle, allowing the vehicle to pass through the gate. When asked, she indicated she could not see the driver's face, only the exterior of the vehicle was visible to her and she could not recall any of the conversation with the driver of that vehicle. When asked if the driver of the vehicle provided a name, she was not certain and again stated she could not recall any of the conversation with the driver of that vehicle.

Security Officer Janisha Johnson indicated that the driver did not say anything that she would consider unusual or give any indication of what he was planning to do once he entered the property. She told Detective Jackson that vehicles are routinely allowed access to the Annex Area after stating that they are ABB employees or that they have a delivery.

This concludes the interview with Johnson.

On October 6, 2010, at approximately 2:25, p.m. Detective Jackson met with victim Darrell Buckley at 4421 Shaw to conduct an interview. The following is a synopsis of that interview.

Darrell Buckley

He stated he arrived at work in the East Annex Building, at approximately 6:30 a.m. He approached supervisor Cory Wilson to receive the daily work assignment. Cory Wilson was speaking with Charles Poe, who is also an employee with ABB.

Buckley and Wilson walked south toward Wilson's office located along the east wall of the building. Buckley and Wilson stopped near Wilson's office door to continue their discussion about work related matters. Buckley was facing northwest and Wilson was standing a few feet west of him. Buckley heard a gunshot and looked to his left (south) and observed an armed subject who he (Buckley) immediately recognized as Timothy H. Timothy H. was armed with what appeared to be a shotgun and was raising the gun to eye level and pointing the gun in Buckley's direction.

Buckley and Wilson ran toward Wilson's office to avoid the gunfire. Timothy H. fired a second time and hit Buckley in the back. Buckley and Wilson entered Wilson's office and immediately went into the office's storage room area. The gunfire started again outside the office with bullets passing through the storage room's west wall. Buckley was hit several times by gunfire while in the

storage room. Buckley located a tool chest and positioned his torso behind it.

Buckley waited until the gunshots ceased and dialed his wife to advise her he had been shot. Buckley dialed 911 for Police and Medical assistance immediately after speaking with his wife. Buckley stated Wilson was also hit by gunfire and could hear him struggling to breathe. Buckley indicated that Wilson expired on the storage room floor shortly after the gunshots ceased. Buckley remained in the storage room until the police arrived. Buckley stated Timothy H. didn't say anything to him during the shooting.

When asked, Buckley stated he has known Timothy H. for approximately thirty years. During that time he has never been involved in an argument or dispute with Timothy H. and has no idea why he was targeted by Timothy H. Buckley worked on the same shift and area with Timothy H. for several years. Timothy H. later became a shift manager and was moved to a different area. Buckley also indicated that years ago Timothy H. used to go with Buckley and other ABB employees to bar/restaurants to play billiards. Over the past five or six years Timothy H. has become withdrawn and distant from the group of co-workers he used to spend time with.

Although they don't work closely at ABB Buckley still greeted and acknowledged Timothy H. in passing on most days.

This concludes Darrell Buckley's statement.

On October 11, 2010, at approximately 4:00, p.m. Detective Jackson met with witness Donald Wilson at 357 Thoreau to conduct an interview. The following is a synopsis of that interview.

Donald Wilson

He was standing in his office located on north side of the East Annex Building at approximately 6:15 a.m. Several minutes later at approximately 6:32 a.m. he heard some noise he described as "loud banging." He assumed that someone started working early. Wilson's wife, Vickie Wilson, called his office phone and advised him to get out of the building because someone was shooting. After a moment he realized that Vickie was serious and decided to leave the building.

Wilson indicated that Maury Bingham was in his office with him at that time. He and Bingham left the building through their back door to see what was going on. Once outside, Wilson observed several people climbing the ladder toward the roof. Wilson and Bingham joined them on the roof. Wilson indicated there were eight to ten people on the roof at that time: Darryl Todd, Tony Edwards, Jerry Brown, Rick Lawrence and Derrick Harris. Wilson stated he could not recall the names of the other individuals. He observed one of those subjects was bleeding from the leg.

From the rooftop Wilson observed a vehicle he described as "trying to get away."

Wilson dialed 911 to pass along that information and advise the dispatcher of their location. Wilson heard more gunshots he described as coming from the parking lot area.

After the gunshots stopped Wilson left the rooftop to check on his son Cory Wilson. After attempting to contact Cory via cell phone with no response, Wilson became worried. Prior to entering the building Wilson changed his mind and returned to the roof as he could not determine if the shooter had left the property or not.

Wilson observed approximately twelve Police cars arrive and officers exit their vehicles rushing toward the ABB facility. Wilson stated he heard more gunshots and the Police Officers ran back to their vehicles and drove back toward Highway 70 where they stopped.

Wilson stated he left the rooftop a second time to check on his wife who was still inside the East Annex Building. Wilson responded directly to the office where his wife was hiding and located her unharmed. Approximately ten minutes later Wilson observed the "S.W.A.T." team enter the building. Wilson and other ABB employees were directed by "S.W.A.T." to exit the office with their hands up.

Wilson observed an ABB employee, Darrel Buckley, exit his son Cory's office "all shot up" walking around stunned. Buckley began apologizing to Wilson stating he was sorry there was nothing he could do. Wilson saw someone lying on the floor in Cory's office. The officers allowed Wilson to look inside Cory's office to identify his son. Upon doing so Wilson positively identified Cory Wilson and also observed a multitude of bullet holes in the office walls and office door.

Wilson stated S.W.A.T. members evacuated the East Annex Building and escorted the employees to buses where they were conveyed to the staging area and Police station.

This concludes Donald Wilson's statement.
