## VICE News-Ipsos Survey for the Brown \& Black Forum

This VICE News-Ipsos poll was conducted between January 8-10, 2020 ahead of the ahead of the 2020 lowa Brown \& Black Democratic Presidential Forum presented by VICE News on January 20, 2020. A sample of 2,013 adults in the U.S. age 18+ were interviewed online in English and Spanish. The sample includes 784 white respondents, 585 African American respondents, and 577 Hispanic respondents. Full methodological details can be found at the end of this document.

## About the Study

This VICE News-Ipsos poll was conducted between January 8-10, 2020. For this survey, a sample of roughly 2,013 adults age $18+$ from the continental U.S. Alaska and Hawaii was interviewed online in English and Spanish. The sample includes 784 white respondents, 585 African American respondents, and 577 Hispanic respondents.

The sample of Hispanic respondents includes those who are considered mostly acculturated, partially acculturated and unacculturated based on an acculturation index. The index includes questions concerning time in the United States, languages spoken, and social network.

The sample for this study was randomly drawn from Ipsos' online panel (see link below for more info on "Access Panels and Recruitment"), partner online panel sources, and "river" sampling (see link below for more info on the Ipsos "Ampario Overview" sample method) and does not rely on a population frame in the traditional sense. Ipsos uses fixed sample targets, unique to each study, in drawing a sample. After a sample has been obtained from the Ipsos panel, Ipsos calibrates respondent characteristics to be representative of the U.S. Population using standard procedures such as raking-ratio adjustments. The source of these population targets is U.S. Census 2016 American Community Survey data. The sample drawn for this study reflects fixed sample targets on demographics. Post-hoc weights were made to the population characteristics on gender, age, race/ethnicity, region, and education.

Statistical margins of error are not applicable to online non-probability polls. All sample surveys and polls may be subject to other sources of error, including, but not limited to coverage error and measurement error. Where figures do not sum to 100, this is due to the effects of rounding. The precision of Ipsos online polls is measured using a credibility interval. In this case, the poll has a credibility interval of plus or minus 2.5 percentage points for all respondents. Ipsos calculates a design effect (DEFF) for each study based on the variation of the weights, following the formula of Kish (1965). This study had a credibility interval adjusted for design effect of the following ( $\mathrm{n}=2,013$, $\mathrm{DEFF}=1.5$, adjusted Confidence Interval=+/-4.0 percentage points).

The poll also has a credibility interval plus or minus 4.0 percentage points for white respondents, plus or minus 4.6 percentage points for African American respondents, and plus or minus 4.7 percentage points for Hispanic respondents.
