I was born and raised in Los Angeles. I attended LAUSD public schools and a California public college. I've raised my family here and built a successful business. All three of my kids attended public schools. The mother of two of my grandchildren is Latina; her parents having emigrated here from Mexico.

I have been blessed with much success. But I couldn't have achieved any of it without the solid educational foundation I received from our local public schools. That's why I have given millions of dollars supporting neighborhood public schools and why my wife, Susan, and I have decided to spend our own resources supporting Dr. Christina Martinez Duran for School Board and opposing incumbent Jackie Goldberg.
