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- 4. Since 1998, I have also served as Chief of the Communicable Disease Epidemiology & Immunization Section of Public Health.
- 5. Further, I currently sit on the CDC's Board of Scientific Counselors, Office of Infectious Diseases, and on the Board of Directors for the Infectious Disease Society of America.
- 6. As the Health Officer for Public Health, it is my job to take action as necessary to maintain public health within King County, to control and prevent the spread of any dangerous, contagious or infectious disease, and to "inform the public as to the causes, nature, and prevention of disease and disability and the preservation and improvement of health within...[the] jurisdiction....." RCW 70.05.070(2) (4)
- 7. Informing the public about health risks is an important part of my role as the Health Officer of our department, Public Health.
- 8. In Washington State, hospitals are required to report to the local health department outbreaks of diseases that occur within their facilities, including those caused by aspergillus. Hospital infection outbreaks are a "notifiable condition".
- 9. After learning of an outbreak in a medical facility, we at Public Health gather information in order to learn the cause and extent of the outbreak, evaluate any investigation and response measures the facility has already instituted, determine whether the facility should undertake additional measures, make recommendations as needed, and provide consultation to the facility related to patient communications.
- 10. We view these activities as an investigation of a notifiable condition, but one in which we seek to assist the facility in a cooperative manner to control the outbreak and prevent a reoccurrence.

other investigation-related documents, are records of a public health investigation, and therefore

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not privileged.

- 39. We routinely share with the public the type of information contained in the CDC report and our other investigative documents when requested.
- 40. I am not seeking with this declaration to harm Children's or to undermine their QI process.
- 41. However, as the Health Officer, and on behalf of the local public health department, we have a responsibility, when requested, to provide the public with documents about our efforts to protect their health, including the occurrence and circumstances related to outbreaks of infections that are notifiable in Washington state.
- 42. The CDC report is a summary of aspergillus at Children's which we believe, on balance, should be available if requested, along with the other records documenting our investigation.
