1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Preventing Pandemic

5 Profiting Act".

"(a) IN GENERAL.—Whoever, in any location that 3 has received a state of emergency declaration, knowingly 4 5 sells or offers for sale, during the effective period of such declaration, any goods or services identified by the Sec-6 retary of Health and Human Services as vital and nec-7 essary for the health, safety, and welfare of consumers, 8 9 including medical treatment, at an unconscionably exces-10 sive price, shall be fined not more than \$1,000, imprisoned 11 not more than 5 years, or both.
