This probabilistic survey was conducted May 28 - 30, 2020, with 510 likely Democratic primary election voters. It has a margin of error of $\pm 4.34\%$. Known registered voters were interviewed via IVR, SMS, and email invitation. This survey was weighted to likely Democratic primary election voter universe.
