Dear Commissioner Pope,

Thank you for the effort you, your hospitals, and your public health experts put into your plans for demonstrating your county's preparedness during the COVID-19 pandemic.

After careful review of your application, as well as a review of statewide data today with the Oregon Health Authority, I have made the decision to pause approval of any county application for a seven day period. We have begun to see concerning signs of outbreaks, increased cases, case positivity, and hospitalizations throughout the state. Because of this, I have decided to wait on lifting restrictions anywhere else in Oregon until we get a better handle on the situation.

Next Wednesday, June 17, the Oregon Health Authority and I will review the data again. You do not need to submit another application.

Your county's application to enter Phase 2 on June 12th has not been approved.

The following items were of concern specifically for your county:

- Your county had a 33% increase in new cases in the last 7 days, above the threshold of 5%.
- The percent of new cases not traced to a known source in the last seven days was 50%, above the recommended threshold of 30%.

We know you are working hard to address the challenges your county faces. I have directed the Oregon Health Authority to provide additional support to your efforts to identify and contain COVID-19 in your county.

Thank you for all of your hard work and vigilance on behalf of Oregonians.
