It has come to our attention that a local organization is calling for the abolition of the OUSD police department. We hear that the group will advocate for this move at the board meeting this Wednesday, March 4th. While the intentions of the organization are noble, we, the undersigned leaders of schools, would like to express some counter points. We empathize with the varied needs of our District, yet in good conscience we must prioritize *safety*. Have we forgotten the many incidents of shootings and unsafe situations on campuses? Who will handle the varied services provided by our officers and SSOs? We would strongly recommend maintaining the OUSD Police Services Department for the following reasons:

- OUSD police respond quickly, unlike the City of Oakland Police (OPD), when called for various reasons:
  - Crime around schools
  - Lockdowns
  - Unstable adults on campus
  - Student abuse issues
  - Weapons or drugs on campus
  - Student mental health emergencies (5150 calls)
  - Child Protective Service Issues
  - Violation of Stay-Away and/or Restraining Orders
  - Assaults by students on staff and other students
  - Assaults by adults on staff, students and other adults
  - Restorative Justice Practices
  - Campus break-in and theft
  - Custody disagreements
  - Domestic violence and child kidnapping issues
- Unlike OPD officers, who come with guns, OUSD police officers come trained with de-escalation and restorative practices. They know our schools, leaders and families and treat our students with the respect and empathy that they deserve.
