


Weekly City Council progress report on self-response rates, September 18, 2020

This week's highlights:

- City of Houston's response rate is **57.4%**. Five districts (A, C, D, E, K) have response rates of 60% or greater.
- All districts have response rates above 50%.
- District E has the census tract with the highest response rate in the city (89.6% in #340400).
- Districts I and J have the lowest overall response rates. Tract #432701 in Districts F and J has the lowest response rate of 24%, with 2,000 households still left to respond.


Total response rates by city council district

Each dot represents a census tract. Some census tracts cross district boundaries. Colors correspond to legend on map.





Overall response rate: 61.3% (Up from 60.7% last week)




District B - Census 2020 Response Rates

Overall response rate: 55.9% (Up from 55.5% last week)




District C - Census 2020 Response Rates V




District D - Census 2020 Response Rates




District E - Census 2020 Response Rates








District H - Census 2020 Response Rates






District J - Census 2020 Response Rates V





Response rates across Super Neighborhoods


